**W**HEREAS the General Assembly of this Island stands Prorogued until Tuesday, the Sixteenth day of January, inst:

I have thought fit, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Executive Council, further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued until Thursday the Twenty-second day of February next, of which all persons concerned are required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
