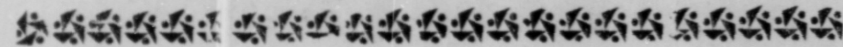

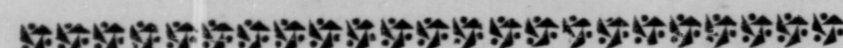

**12,000 Troops Ready to Embark.**

**TRANSPORTS READY TO TAKE TROOPS FROM INDIA.**

England Thoroughly Ready for War if it Should Occur.

BOMBAY, Aug. 14.—Preparations are about completed for the despatch of 12,000 troops to South Africa.

A number of transports are in readiness in Indian waters and in the event of war the troops will be embarked simultaneously here and at Calcutta.

**ENGLAND'S ARMY**

**A German Critic Points out Some Weak Points**

BERLIN, Aug. 11.—The first of a series of criticisms on the British army by a German observer appears in the July number of the Berl. Neue Militarische Blatter. The author, Herr A. H. Hann, appears to write with much knowledge of his subject.

Dealing with the recruiting question Herr Hornung calls attention to the practice the authorities have been forced into of lowering the conditions of enlistment as regards age, chest measurement, and general fitness for service. "The bulk of the English regular army," he says, "is composed of an element insufficiently trained, physically and mentally."

Touching on the state of the militia Herr Hornung points out that the officers of this branch of the army are 700 short of the number required.

Coming to the volunteers, the German critic puts his finger on a number of weak points, including the insufficient allowance of cartridges, and the deficiency of ranges.

"Under the new regulations," he adds "the maximum distance at which volunteer marksmen practise is 600 yards. But with the Lee-Metford rifle, with which this force is now armed, the distance, in my opinion, should be increased, to at least 1,000 yards."

**Arrest of a Number of Bonapartists**

**THE OPENING OF THE DREYFUS MARTIAL**

Seizure of an Orleans Newspaper by the Police.

PARIS, Aug. 14.—The police have seized the Drapeau newspaper office in the house of Mr. Andre De Buffet representative of the Duke of Orleans, was searched and a number of papers seized.

Mr. Maillard of the Petit Parisien staff has been arrested.

PARIS, Aug. 14.—Emily Crawford in her review of the situation says France is divided into two hostile forces and that the battle has begun in real earnest.

The first few days of the Dreyfus court-martial were but skirmishing.

The arrest of Paul Deroulede and twenty three of his Bonapartist allies betokens the gathering of the storm.

The Dreyfus trial is a trial of strength which cannot end in a drawn fight.

It will be a desperate combat, in which neither side will yield unless utterly routed.

**AT THE WORLD'S MEET.**

**The Events Contested—More Records Broken.**

MONTREAL, Aug. 14.—At the World's Bicycle Meet the team race for the International Shield was won by the United States.

Major Taylor, of Boston, won the two mile professional race, defeating Tom Butler and Charles McCarthy.

The five mile tandem present race was won by Fred Hooper and John Anetson, who broke all previous records in 10 mins. and 14 1-5 seconds.

Wilson Coleman, of Boston, won the five mile handicap professional.

Carl Peabody, of Chicago, won the special one mile race for the Columbus trophy.

The sixty-two mile race was won by Harry Gibson, of Cincinnati.

**French Schooner Sunk.**

LONDON, Aug. 14.—The French schooner Pauboto was sunk in collision yesterday off Lowestoff, by the steamer Hercules. Seven persons drowned. The steamer rescued the remainder of the crew.

**The Counsel For Captain Dreyfus**

**AMBUSHED AND SHOT AT BY TWO SCOUNDRELS.**

Wounded in Back. Still Alive But Worst Feared

RENNES, August 14.—The latest development in the Dreyfus case caps the climax of sensationalism. Yesterday Maitre Labori, the able lawyer who has conducted the Dreyfus case, was ambushed by two men.

One shot was fired, and Mr. Labori was hit on the back.

Mr. Labori fell in the roadway. He was still alive this morning, but it is believed he will die from the wound.

The miscreant who fired the cowardly shot was arrested.

**THE WEST HURON CASE**

**Presbyterian Preacher Denounces the Corruption of it**

OTTAWA, Aug. 14.—Rev. Professor Rose, of Montreal, Presbyterian College, preaching in the Bank Street Presbyterian Church last night, spoke of the West Huron election scandal as a blot upon national life, inflicted, not in the wild and woolly west, or in benighted Quebec but in Godly Ontario.

He denounced the participation in such political methods by men high in public office.

**Things are Looking Warlike.**

LONDON, August 11.—The Daily Mail publishes the following despatch from Johannesburg: By the special article added the Grootvlei (the constitution of the Transvaal) the President is authorized, in the event of war, rebellion or other emergency, to proclaim martial law, and to compel every inhabitant of the republic to bear arms in its defence. The Volksraad adopted this amendment with enthusiasm. The Pretoria forts are being strengthened and Boer agents are buying up all the available draught oxen in Bechuanaland.
