Sask. Is Only Province Free From Fatality

By THE CANADIAN PRESS Saskatchewan was the only province free from fatalities as traffic accidents accounted for 41 deaths in Canada's weekend accident toll.

A Canadian Press survey, conducted from 6 p.m. local time Friday to midnight Sunday, showed a total count of 58 deaths due to accidents.

Six persons were drowned, five died in hunting accidents, three were burned to death, two died in farm accidents and one woman was hit by a train.

ONTARIO LEADS Ontario topped the provincial death toll with 25 accidental fatalities. Quebec was next with 18. Manitoba and Alberta each reported three deaths. New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Newfoundland and British Columbia each had two and Prince Edward Island one.

Three youths died when their car hit a train near Drummondville, Que., and four persons were killed in a two-car collision in Southern Ontario.

Three Lachaplanes were burned to death in a Lennoxville, Que., fire. Three men were drowned in a lake near Ignace in Northwestern Ontario.
