10,000th Member Welcomed To Quarter Century Club

Today marks the significant milestone in the history of Eaton's of Summerside. The Quarter Century Club enrolls its 10,000th member, Gordon Serruon, who joined the company 25 years ago and is now employed in the furniture department of the downtown budget store in Toronto.

The unique club was formed in January, 1919, the year of Eaton's Golden Jubilee. When 78 men and women had joined with the company for 25 years or more, handed together "for their mutual protection, and to keep in closer touch with those of the old brigade." The original of the Quarter Century Club constitution adopted 43 years ago, is still filed in Eaton's Archives.

The club group were charter members of an organization that was to grow rapidly with the passing years. Induction of the 10,000th member into the club is proof of its endurance and now, less than half a century later, Eaton's has 3,671 members actively serving the company's Serruon, who joined the company 25 years ago and is now employed in the furniture department of the downtown budget store in Toronto.

The resolution laid down at the beginning by the original membership is still the mainstay of Eaton's Quarter Century Club. It reaffirmed one of the major policies proclaimed in 1919 by the company's founder and first president, Timothy Eaton, and practised to-day in more than 40 main and branch stores and over 500 other outlets across the nation.
