Murder in Ireland. DUBLIN, Nov. 27. Detective Cox was yesterday shot by a returned convict.

Rustico Bank. OTTAWA, Nov. 27. The Directors of the Farmers Bank, Rustico, have applied to the Dominion Government for a new Act of Incorporation.

Dervisch Pasha. CAIRO, Nov. 27. The charges against Dervisch Pasha, of encouraging Arabi Pasha, have been satisfactorily refuted.

GENERAL CABLE NEWS. LONDON, Nov. 24. The British ship Rochester, from Liverpool for Philadelphia, has been abandoned in a sinking condition.

The railway bridge at Bromley, near London, fell this morning. Seven workmen were killed and several others injured.

At a meeting of the Home Rule League, held to-day, the association was dissolved. The consideration of the closure question was resumed in the House to-night.

PARIS, Nov. 24. Thieves broke into the Cathedral of St. Denis, this afternoon, and stole a quantity of gold and silver articles.

QUEBEC, Nov. 24. Woodley's old shoe factory, destroyed by fire last night, belonged to Mr. James G. Ross, and was managed by Mr. Grant.

It has been officially reported to the Government that widespread distress is feared in Ireland this winter.

The Marquis of Salisbury, in an address before the Scottish Conservative Club at Edinburgh, last night, taunted the Liberal Government with having adopted its predecessor's Egyptian policy.
