

Improved Legal Aid Services Seen Canadian Arctic Need

OTTAWA (CP)—There is an urgent need for improved legal aid services in Canada's northern communities, the Northwest Territories Council has been told.

Robert Porritt, a Hay River businessman who represents Mackenzie South on the member council, said someone should be appointed to give legal advice, particularly to Indians and Eskimos who are in legal difficulties.

"We need some sort of public defender in the Territories and the situation is getting more urgent."

"Most of the people coming into court are Indians and Eskimos, who most of the time don't even know what it's all about or what their rights are, and even if they did, couldn't pay for a lawyer."

Mr. Porritt spoke during a general debate in reply to commissioner B. G. Sivertz's opening address, a debate which corresponds to the throne speech debate in the Commons.

On the third day of the session, which is expected to continue for two or more weeks, they discussed topics ranging from the need to use more local materials in construction projects to the transfer of responsibility for such matters as education and welfare from the Federal government to the territorial government.

With regard to such responsibilities, now in the hands of the northern affairs department, Commissioner Sivertz said that in six months it might be possible to set up a time table for the transfer from federal to territorial jurisdiction.

A first step would be the physical transfer of the administration of territorial government from Ottawa to the territories by Sept. 1, 1967.

Mr. Porritt's statements touched off a prolonged debate. At its conclusion, council voted to ask the Canadian Bar Association how legal aid could be provided.

The council also wants extension of the legal aid program to the Northwest Territories.

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Conservatives Plan Debate On Ontario Redistribution

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At the same time, a similar petition by 10 Quebec Liberals was printed in the Commons official journal, thus forcing a future debate on the proposed redistribution for that province.

Mr. Winkler, MP for Grey-Bruce, said in an interview he plans talk with other Ontario Conservatives next week to draft the petition to Commons Speaker Lucien Lamoureux.

He objected to the methods followed by the independent redistribution commission for Ontario in reworking the electoral map. He said the commission could have used county boundaries and traditional links between various communities to better advantage.

Reports of the 10 provincial redistribution commissions were tabled in the Commons Jan. 19 and MPs have 30 days from that date to petition for debates to air their criticisms and suggestions. Any 10 MPs can force a debate on any province.

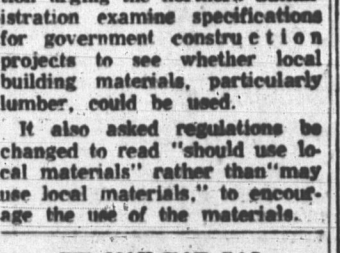

It was certainly no accident that Jordan chose to take the diamond finesse. He had good reason to do so. He knew that the hand could scarcely be made except with the aid of a squeeze and he therefore mentally had to assign one defender a holding of four spades and three clubs.

He had already judged from the opponents' silence during the bidding that their hearts were divided 5-5.

Consequently, when West followed to the second diamond lead, Jordan could not assume a 2-2 trump division — that would mean that East had six black cards instead of seven and make a squeeze inoperable. Jordan therefore placed East with the seven black cards necessary, and hence, a singleton diamond. The finesse succeeding Jordan easily made the rest.
