A NUMBER of Nova Scotia coal owners are in Ottawa. In an interview with one of them it was learned that a total delivery of some 275,000 tons of coal will be required in Montreal next season. The representative of one extensive coal mining interest in Cape Breton has contracted with the Montreal Gas Company for the supply of some sixty thousand tons of gas coal.

THE revival of the whipping post has occasionally been advocated for certain classes of crime, but its introduction must be guarded against abuse, as people claiming but an ordinary share of human feelings will never consent to the whip being applied to such an unmerciful extent as in the case of a convicted burglar in Lynchburg, Virginia, who has been sentenced to receive a hundred and fifty-six lashes on the bare back.

STEEPS weighing from 1,200 to 1,700 pounds best suit the British butchers, as they can cut up the carcasses of such most economically for their customers, and the size of the pieces are more acceptable to them. With shorthorns, Herefords, and Polled Angus cattle, and the crosses of their males on good-sized native females, the steers, if well fed from calfhood, can be easily made to attain the above weights the spring they are two or three years old.

BURNED TO DEATH.—A despatch from St. John's, N. F., Feb. 7th, says: Two sisters named Moran, elderly persons, engaged in the grocery business on Water Street, St. John's, were admitted to infirmary. At 11 o'clock on Sunday night, the 5th, one of them, intoxicated, ran out of the house and cried for help, saying her sister was dead. The neighbours rushed in and found that the younger sister had fallen into a large open fire-place, and was literally roasted alive. All the clothes were burned off, and the body charred and blistered in a sickening manner. The two women were in comfortable circumstances and the owners of a large amount of property. It was only after awaking out of a drunken stupor that the older sister was conscious of the terrible accident. The fire in the grate had even gone out before she awoke.

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS. BRITISH POLITICS. INFERNAL MACHINES. Release of Suspects DOMINION PARLIAMENT

Special Despatch to the Examiner.

EDINBURGH, Feb. 15. Two boxes, containing infernal machines, which had been delivered at two different addresses, exploded to-day on being opened, and eight persons were injured. A man named Castello has been arrested in connection with the outrage, which is believed to have been prompted by personal motives.

DUBLIN, Feb. 15. The suspects, James O'Connor, Henry Burton and Mallon have been released from prison.

BERLIN, Feb. 15. Heister Brothers, of Munich, have failed with liabilities of £25,000.

RALEIGH, Feb. 15. Deputy Sheriff Blake was killed yesterday day, by a mulatto whom he had arrested. A posse is in pursuit of the murderer.

LONDON, Feb. 15. The cotton spinners of North and South-west Lancashire have withdrawn their demand for increased wages.

The Admiralty has informed the Royal Geographical Society that the Government cannot fit out an expedition to search for Leigh Smith, but will contribute £50,000 towards meeting the expenses of a private expedition, provided the necessary extra funds shall be forthcoming and the arrangements meet the approval of the Admiralty.

In the Commons this afternoon, Chas. Dilke, Under Secretary for Foreign Affairs, replying to attacks on the foreign policy of the Government, denied that any French troops has been prepared for embarkation to Egypt.

The Government still adheres to European concert as a means of adjusting foreign difficulties, and believes its influence will be useful to the Egyptian question. He denied the existence of a reported revolt at Herat. In regard to Jews in Russia, all precedents showed that British interference in the internal affairs of foreign countries, would meet with rebuff, and do more harm than good.

The Roman Catholic clergy of the diocese of Meath, have recommended Patrick Egan as the candidate of the Irish party for the vacancy in the Commons by the death of A. M. Sullivan.

Commander Weidam H. Selby of the British man-of-war "Falcon," while on a shooting excursion near Artaki, in Asia Minor was seriously wounded by an Albanian with an axe. At the request of Lord Dufferin, British Ambassador at Constantinople, the President of the Turkish Council of Ministers has ordered the arrest of the assailant. A Turkish and British man-of-war have proceeded to Artaki. Commander Selby is in a critical condition.

OTTAWA, Feb. 15. A large amount of routine business was transacted in the House to-day. Over forty notices of motion were passed.

The Minister of Marine and Fisheries' report will be brought down on Friday. Dr. Mattart, M. P., Mr. Hackett, M. P., and Senator Montgomery arrived from P. E. Island last night.
