Pearson Explains Reason For Delaying Pension Plan

OTTAWA (CP)—Prime Minister Pearson has confirmed in the new year. He was immediately criticized from two sides.

Besides the pension plan, Mr. Pearson said these other items won't come before Parliament at the current session:

1. The Columbia River development treaty — because talks with the United States and British Columbia aren't at the stage required to bring the treaty to Parliament before Christmas.

2. Establishment of an Eastern minister of agriculture, of a Canadian Development Corporation and legislation to put the Unemployment Insurance Fund on a sound financial basis — because they will take a great deal of parliamentary time.

WORK ON ESTIMATES For the remaining weeks of this session, he gave top priority to completing study of the 1963-64 spending estimates. During this study, Agriculture Minister Hays would announce "improvements in policy" for the benefit of farmers. He did not elaborate.

The Canada Pension Plan was being shelved for this session because it would be "inappropriate" to proceed with it until after a Nov. 23 federal-provincial conference. This would not leave enough time for full examination and debate.
