Students also had the opportunity to direct questions to Pres. Meonke. The topics were the continuing problem of unemployment among students and government funding to U.P.E.I. Several pertinent announcements with regard to the levels of government were made to the U.P.E.I. students.

Also, as a result of last week's activities, a Women's group is now in its initial stages of formation at U.P.E.I. More information will be made at a later date with regard to this.
