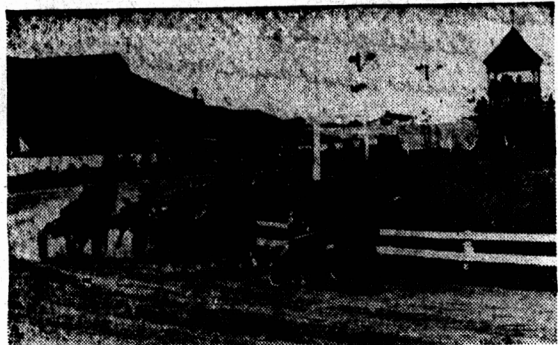

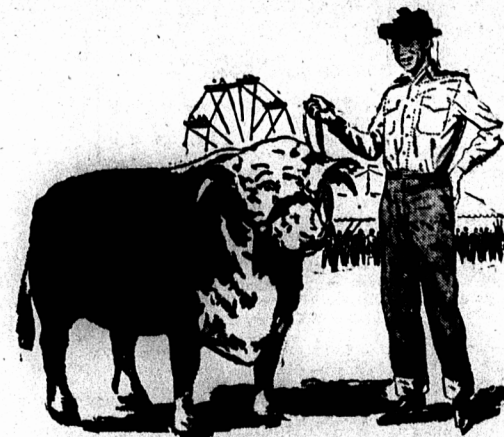

Live Stock



For sixty years the best Live Stock, Sheep, Swine and Poultry have been exhibited and judged on our grounds. We take pride in the fact that our encouragement coupled with that of the Dominion and Provincial Governments, has brought our standard of quality so high that we are known throughout the length and breadth of the American continent as among the best producers of special types of Horses, Cattle, Sheep, Swine and Poultry. We want everyone to take an interest in our Exhibition for the men who are exhibiting are contributing in no small measure to the prosperity of the Garden of the Gulf.

Through the co-operation of the Dominion and Provincial Governments we have built six new barns to accommodate our large cattle entry list. These are up-to-date in every respect. In addition we have spent many thousands of dollars in improving our plant. Over \$13,000 in purses, prizes, premiums and awards is being offered for this, the greatest Live Stock Show in years. Our cattle barns, including the new ones, will be filled to capacity with animals valued at over \$350,000—See the swine that are commanding such premium prices from breeders in Western Canada and Ohio. There will be a cattle parade of show winners between 7:30 and 8:15 in front of Grand Stand evenings.

Poultry
