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# Saints And Mounties Play To Scoreless Draw

A. J. MacAdam's Saint Dunstan's University senior football team battled to a scoreless draw with the Mount A. thirteen here Saturday afternoon in the first game of the N.B.-P.E.I. Intercollegiate Series.

The game was played on the S. D. U. field with a driving north-easterly wind carrying a biting cold rain down on the spectators and players. Most of the spectators watched the game from their cars or through a college window.

Saints held a slight territorial advantage over their opponents and their inexperienced scrum out-heeled that of the Mounties. The weather made the ball as hard to handle as a wet cake of soap with the result that there were few good half-line plays.

Each team moved into scoring position several times but neither ever crossed their opponents five yard line. Saints threatened once in the first half and twice in the second with the Mounties doing the same thing.

Saints came close in the dying minutes of the first half on a long run and several scrums on the Mounties five yard line but could not cross. Midway in the half the Mounties threatened and were awarded a penalty kick about 25 yards from the bar but could not make it.

Early in the second half, Pete Dunphy, who played a great game for the Saints, followed up a long dribble to grab in the ball and go across standing up but the play was called back on account of a knock-on. Joe Mallette set up their next scoring opportunity with a 20-yard run but the Mounties line held the S. D. U. attacks and a penalty kick relieved the pressure.

This penalty kick was the signal for the Mounties to start their most dangerous scoring thrust. White advanced to the Red and White five-yard line and only sharp tackling by the Saints halted them. After their first repulse they came back again but two brilliant tackles by Kenny MacDonald and Jerry Clinton snuffed out a nice half-line run.

Saints supporters were pleased with the work of the S. D. U. scrum which was regarded as light and inexperienced. Joe Mallette turned in a fine game at his fullback post and was especially effective with his long penalty kicks. Pete Dunphy was probably the pick of the backfield with his tricky ball handling and kicking.

Saints had several chances to score on penalty kicks but in all cases the distance was too great to expect "Scouts" Coyle to boot the pigskin through for the game winning points.

The game was refereed by Gordon Bennett who did an excellent job on calling the plays.
