North Michigan College Plays Host At Breakfast

By IDA BAILEY ALLEN... Promptly at nine o'clock on a Sunday morning, the Chef and I stepped into the conference room of Le Hall at Northern Michigan State College, Marquette, where we had been invited to breakfast with several other guests. Our host was Dr. Edgar Harden, president of the college.

GRACIOUS LIVING
This was an exceptionally beautiful room. The walls were partly paneled with polished Michigan wood, partly covered with golden grass wallpaper. The window draperies were in cool chateaux. A big jar of red berries and chrysanthemums stood on a table where small glasses of chilled orange juice and tomato juice, in gold-coated metal holders, awaited us. They came breakfast at the huge, polished dark wood table. The decorations were chrysanthemums and bitter-sweet berries, the table mats handwoven, graced with Irish linen aprons and creamy white Haviland china with touches of gold. The meal was impeccably served by a young woman working her way through college.

GUIDED TOUR
After breakfast, the men guests left to take their wives to church and the youngsters to Sunday school while Dr. Harden drove us around the college grounds to show us the new buildings and a big acreage newly acquired for future development.

It is quite evident that Dr. Harden is not only a distinguished educator and scholar but a man of vision and practical accomplishment.

Sunday breakfast: Winter fruit cup; cornmeal - Canadian bacon; waffles; cranberry conserve; whipped butter; honey, maple, or orange syrup; broiled Canadian bacon; coffee.

Monday dinner may be based on this brunch with a few slight changes:

Start with a substantial vegetable soup, then enjoy the waffles and Canadian bacon. Finish with the winter fruit cup, and a choice of coffee, tea or milk.

Cornmeal-Canadian Bacon Waffles: In a shaker or large glass jar, measure 2 c. milk. Break in 2 eggs; add 6 tsp. cooking oil. Stir in 1 c. fine-chopped Canadian bacon, 1/4 c. enriched cornmeal and 1 1/2 c. ready-pancake mix. Shake (or stir) vigorously about 15 times or until batter is fairly smooth. Bake on heated waffle iron until steaming stops.

Cranberry Conserve: Combine in a 3-qt. saucepan, 1 qt. (1 lb.) raw cranberries, 1 c. water, the juice and pulp 2 medium oranges
