University For More Students
OTTAWA (CP) — Canada's higher-education program should be based on making university-level training available to one-quarter of her college-age population, S. H. Deeks of Toronto told the Canadian Conference on Education Wednesday.

Mr. Deeks, executive director of the Industrial Foundation on Education, said the figure is based on statistical analysis and would mean an annual enrolment of 225,000, rising within 10 years to 360,000. Present enrolment was 86,500 undergraduates.

Coldwell Says Vote Unnecessary

SASKATOON (CP) — CCF Leader M. J. Coldwell, terming the March 31 federal general election "unnecessary," charged Prime Minister Diefenbaker Monday night with seeking a meek and subservient majority in the Commons.

The winter date for a "snap" election "reflects utter disregard for the voters, and particularly the farm voters," he said at a political rally here.

"Never had an election been more unnecessary than at this time," Mr. Coldwell said of the March 31 vote, only the fifth winter election since Confederation and the first since 1940.
