

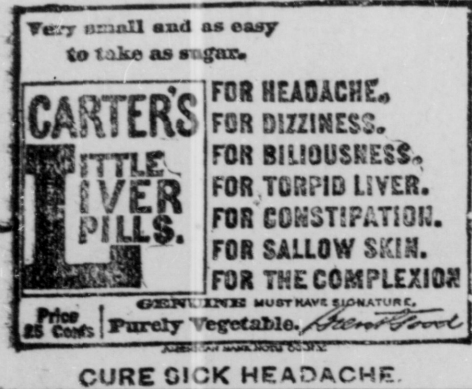

THE ELECTIONS.

THE majority in Prince Edward Island has set its seal of approval upon the acts of the Liberal party that has been in office here. Annual deficits with taxation have been distinctly approved. A big increasing debt is considered a good thing. It's all right to jump Jim Crow and make deals in respect to questions of temperance and morality. Violation of the first duty of government, which is to uphold and administer the laws, has been condoned. Pineauism may be practised with impunity. These are the general conclusions to be drawn from the result of the elections of yesterday.

This result has proceeded from the unscrupulous exertion of all the influences possessed by two Governments. Agents of these Governments, thoroughly organized—men who had something to gain for themselves—have been unceasing in their vigilance and activity. Promises of offices, large and small, intimidation of those who held office or position of any kind, intimidation of the relatives of such governmental employees,—money, whiskey, etc., these were the weapons by which the people's desires after a better government than they have had were thwarted.

On the other hand, everyone must admit that the Opposition fought a noble battle. Taken by surprise, with every point of vantage in the hands of the Governments in co-partnership, the Hon. Daniel Gordon and his supporters are to be commended and congratulated upon their spirited and gallant struggle to obtain for the people a good, economical, progressive and impartial administration of public affairs. Nor have they, in spite of all the influences and all the interests arrayed against them, been altogether unsuccessful. In several districts the majorities for the Government are so decidedly small that, taking into consideration the means employed in behalf of the government, the Opposition secured a moral victory. John McLean, John Kickham, Murdoch McKinnon, John A. Macneil, James E. McDonald, Henry W. O., J. F. Arsenault, Archibald J. McDonald, the Leader of the Opposition will have at his back in the Legislature, men of high ability,—true and honest men, who may be trusted to do their duty towards the Province;—and it is possible there may be additions to their number.

Not in mortals to command success; But we'll do more. Sempronius, We'll deserve it."

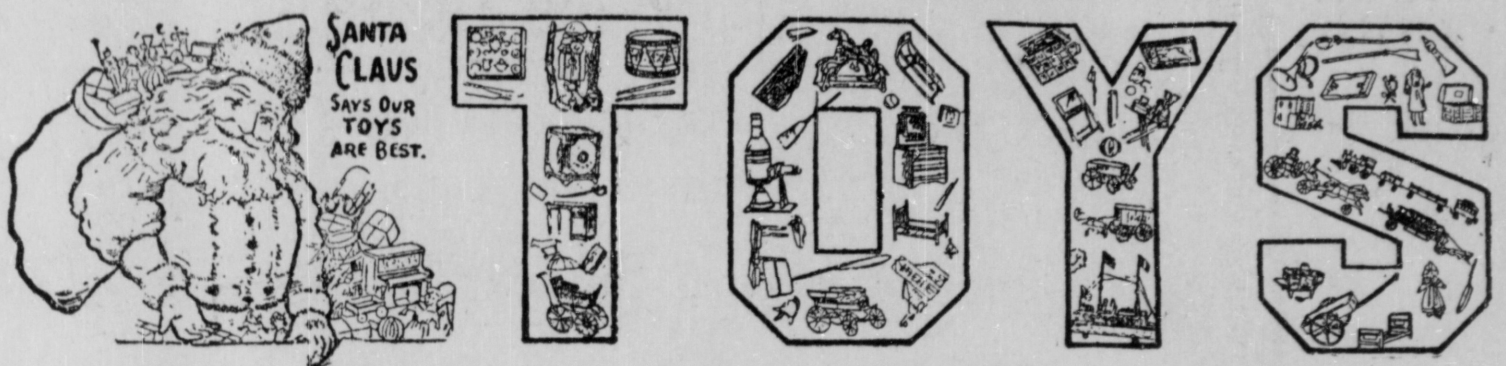
That the Opposition deserves success cannot be doubted by any man who regards the case of this Province with an intelligent mind and unprejudiced eyes. We deeply and heartily regret the loss of those who, by unfair and illegitimate means, have been overcome in the struggle. But we hope and believe that there are among the successful Conservatives in Opposition, men who will, ere long, lead a re-organized party on to victory and to the realization of

definite aims and policy for the betterment of the Province.

While Sir Louis Davies and Premier Farquharson have, by their scandalous tactics and human devices obtained a victory for the Provincial Administration, the administration itself has been practically swept away. Every office in the Government is vacant. The Hon. Angus McMillan, Provincial Secretary-Treasurer and Commissioner of Public Lands, voluntarily retired previous to the election, on account of the increasing infirmities of his age. He was one of the old-time Liberals whom THE EXAMINER has always been ready to commend,—an honest man, and able in his day and generation. Mr. James R. McLean, Commissioner of Public Works, was, on the other hand, arbitrarily retired by his party. But he will, doubtless, continue to draw a salary from some other official source. Hon. Peter Sinclair, will no longer be present in the Legislature and at the Council Board to give his sage advice, and the Hon. Benjamin Rogers, of Charlottetown has given place to the Hon. Benjamin Rogers, Alberton. Premier Farquharson will have to completely reorganize his Cabinet.

In reason, little good can be expected to proceed from the causes which have resulted in the latest success of the Liberal party. But occasionally in government, as in life, good springs from evil. Some good men, some men of original ideas have, strangely enough, been elected to support the Farquharson administration; and we are not

without hope that these men will exercise a beneficial influence in or over the Government which must now be reformed.

In any case, the good of the country, the greatest good of the greatest number, is the object to be sought alike by the Government and the Opposition; and we trust that this object will not be lost sight of by either.

THE NEW PARLIAMENT.

ACCORDING to the completed returns sent to Ottawa, including that of East Queen's, the new Parliament will contain 125 supporters of the Government, 78 in the Opposition and 10 Independents. By Provinces, the returns show,—

So that the Government will have a majority of 47,—and if the Independents all vote with them, 57.

In the late Parliament, when it closed, the parties stood 136 Liberals and Independents, and 77 straight Opposition. The Montreal Gazette sets down the figures in this way:

In the new Parliament the same divisions show:

Thus, giving the Government the benefit of all the Independents, they have one man less in the new Parliament than they had in the old.

More than that, the returns show that apart from Quebec the Government is in a majority.

Quebec is, more than ever, master of the Administration; and the Quebec majority was won on the race cry alone.
