Life Insurance Sales Booming In Canada

OTAWA (CP) — The Canadian life insurance business is still flying high.

Last year the life companies put nearly \$1,000,000,000 of new ordinary, group and industrial life insurance into force in Canada.

It brought the year-end total of all life insurance in force to a staggering \$36,500,000,000.

Canadian companies did about 67 per cent of the new business. American firms had a 27-percent slice and the British additions to reserves—rose during the year by \$38,678,461.

They boosted their investments during the year by a whopping \$691,224,799 to \$10,497,474,329.

Steel said there would be a tremendous push to build inventories unless here is an early labor settlement.

"Auto makers will set the pace and other big users will follow their example," the magazine added. "Small users who can't afford to hedge may not be able to get enough steel to meet their day-to-day requirements because bigger mills have pre-empted so much space on mill books."

Steel makers will have trouble of their own in the event of a big inventory build-up. Steel said one producer would have inventory building could generate a level of demand that would cause a costly over-expansion of steel making capacity. 2. Inventories increased competition from imports. 3. Eventually cause worker layoffs as inventories are liquidated. 4. Unsettled U.S. foreign trade balance. 5. Generally depress the economy.

Meanwhile, the steel making upward trend continues. Steel said that this week would produce the eighth consecutive weekly increase in steel production, with the output slightly 2,500,000 ingot tons of last week.

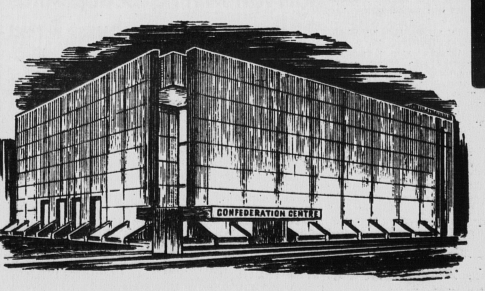
