Tignish Proposes Slaughter House

TIGNISH — The proposal to establish a slaughter house or abattoir in the Tignish area was discussed at a meeting of interested persons called by the Tignish Co-operative Association Tuesday afternoon.

The manager of the association, Gerald Handrahan, told the meeting that the law will be enforced on the inspection of all animals killed in the province, and if a slaughter house or killing plant is not established in the Tignish area, the farmers of the district will have to depend on other centres for these services, adding greatly to their costs.

Inspection is essential for all meat sold here stressed.

Robert Campbell, M.L.A., endorsed Mr. Handrahan's suggestions particularly in regard to the extra cost of taking animals to Summerside and then having to call back for the carcasses later. He said if a plant is built on a community basis, assistance may be forthcoming from the provincial government.

The well attended meeting also heard favorable expressions for the plant from Mr. McCus, Joseph Conway, M. Locke, secretary of the O'Leary Co-operative; Roy Cloboskey, Albert Foley, Alberton; Jack Clark, Alma; Gregory Martin, Joseph A. Gallant and P. Martin.

Mr. Cloboskey, Mr. Handrahan and Mr. Clark were named on a committee to interview all relatives in the area to get their views on the matter. Another meeting will be held shortly.

Tuesday's meeting was held in the Tignish Legion home with Wesley Gallant presiding. A discussion on the potato industry followed.

Tribal Fighting Claimed Quelled In Negro State

ENGCOBO, South Africa (Reuters)—Tribal fighting was quelled Wednesday in the Transkei reserve, an area slated to become South Africa's first Negro state.

Reports said there was only one serious casualty.

The battle with spears and axes began Tuesday night when the local headmen of a township told 40 tribesmen to move their huts. The 40 angry warriors attacked the headman's guard but later fled into the woods after police reinforcements arrived.

The reinforcements — three truckloads of warriors accompanied by about 30 South African policemen — were sent by Chief Kaiser Mantanzima.

Mantanzima, chairman of the Transkei territorial authority, is expected to become the first Negro premier when the province has dubbed him government stooge.

SAYS POLICE LOOF
Gen. R.J. van den Bergh, head of the criminal investigation department in Pretoria, said Mantanzima's guards searched the area in the morning while South African police stood by. He said police took no part in the operation.

After finding no trace of the attackers, the chief's men and the police withdrew.
