Halifax Man Is Fined \$50 For Obstructing Policeman

Magistrate A. J. Haslam, QC, fined Lloyd MacPhail, Halifax, N.S. \$50 and costs for obstruction of a police officer when he appeared in city police court Saturday.

Alton Blair Bulger, O'Leary, was fined \$40 and costs or 30 days for driving a motor vehicle without due care and attention.

Another Halifax resident, John MacFadden, was fined \$25 and costs for being drunk and incapable.

Charged with vagrancy, Hollis Diamond of New Wiltshire, was fined \$20 and costs or 10 days.

Ralph Chandler of Charlottetown was fined \$30 and costs or 30 days for being drunk and disorderly.

Two persons charged with illegal possession of liquor were each fined \$20 and costs or 30 days.

For unnecessary horn blowing, Allan Charles Robbins of East Royal was fined \$15 and costs or five days.

Wayne Axworthy of Charlottetown, charged with assault

was fined \$10 and costs or five days.

Joseph Cannon of Charlottetown charged with being drunk and disorderly was remanded until Dec. 1.

Charged with theft of an article valued at less than \$50.

Philip Francis Ross of Charlottetown was remanded until Dec. 4.

The case against Allison MacLeod Ltd., Charlottetown, charged with using dealer's licences for private use was adjourned until Dec. 5.

Leslie Alfred Affleck of Charlottetown charged with vagrancy also had his case adjourned until Dec. 5. One person charged with being drunk and incapable was given 30 days in jail.

Moncton Rail, Air Facilities Are Criticized

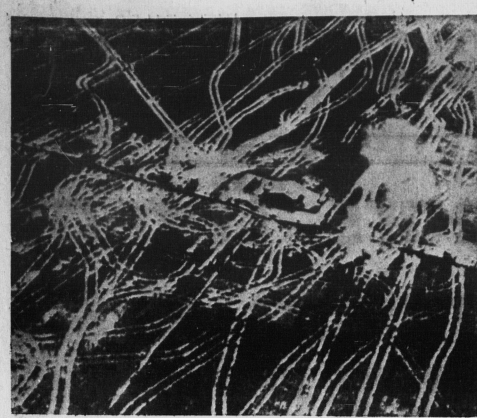

Two Injured, Tractor Split In Accident

SOURSIS — Two persons were injured, a tractor split in two and a car badly damaged in an accident at St. Peter's, 38 miles west of here Saturday evening.

The vehicle, a 1959 model car, was driven by Earl Bruce Riggs of Charlottetown who was proceeding east when he came in collision with the rear end of a tractor, driven by Earl Malcolm MacLeod of St. Peter's. Half of the tractor toppled into the ditch and the other half remained on the highway.

Neither driver was hurt but passengers in the car, John Daniel MacPhee, St. Peter's, and James MacDonald, Charlottetown, were taken to the Kings County Memorial Hospital, Montague, with under-minor injuries.

The Souris detachment, RCMP investigated the accident.

Tignish Students Lectured On Value Of Lobster

TIGNISH — Jerry Gillispie, Halifax, chief of the educational branch of fisheries for the Maritimes, delivered a lecture on the conservation of the lobster to students of Tignish Regional High School Thursday afternoon.

In his talk Mr. Gillispie outlined the value received by the fishermen in protecting the small lobster, and the need for fishermen to carry out the regulations.

Slides were shown on the different stages of development of the lobster.

Accompanying Mr. Gillispie on his west Prince County speaking tour was Thane Douglas, fisheries protection officer of Ellerslie.
