**Local Officer Takes Course At Kingston**

One hundred and sixteen navy, army and air force officers and eleven civil servants recently took a ten-day tri-service course at Kingston, Ontario, which began on November 26.  
Under the supervision of Brigadier W. J. Lawson, Judge Advocate General for the three services, the course is headed by Wing Commander J. H. Hollies. Ten other officers are instructing.  
The course was in the interpretation and manipulation of the National Defence Act and new defence regulations.  
Among the seven F. C. N. officers from the Pacific Command chosen to take this course were: Lt. Cmdr. Alan B. Cosh of Charlottetown, and Lt. Cmdr. P. H. Sinclair, whose wife is a granddaughter of the late Judge A. B. Warburton.  
Heading the list of civil servants were James A. Sharpe, assistant deputy minister of national defence; and A. W. Bannard, assistant chief treasury officer with the Department of National Defence.  
The National Defence Act is a purely Canadian disciplinary code applicable to all the armed services. Included in this one statute is all legislation relating to the Department of National Defence and the Canadian forces. The short course also includes syndicate discussions and lectures.  
While on the course, students were quartered at Port Frontenac, the Royal Canadian School of Signals, and the Royal Canadian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers School, all at Kingston.

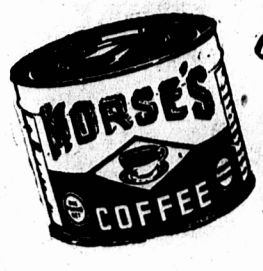
**F. R. Ashworth Passes Away**

HALIFAX, Dec. 14—Frank Raymond Ashworth, 60 Beech Street, passed away last night at the Victoria General Hospital after a brief illness. He was born in Manchester, England, and came to Canada when 11 years of age, living in Toronto for some years and

later moving to Halifax.  
Mr. Ashworth was credit manager of Miner Rubber Company and had been in the service of the firm for the past 32 years, both at Toronto and Halifax.
