OTTAWA (CP) — Some federal authorities believe the government can get through the next fiscal year without increasing taxes.

It is a question now of whether their arguments will win out over those who believe tax boosts are essential if the next budget deficit is to be slashed and the market for government bonds strengthened.

Some of these opposing views may be resolved in part by federal judgments as to how well the Canadian economy may turn out this year.
