Change in Act Has Local Effect

Some recent changes in the Unemployment Insurance Act and regulations which became effective on January 1 brings an additional number of persons in this area under its coverage.

Unemployment Insurance Fund, Earl G. Cannon, manager of the local office of the National Employment Service, said yesterday.

Certain employments hitherto excluded as being employment in agriculture have now become insurable by the new regulations. He explained they include employment in the breeding or raising of poultry, in egg grading, in chick hatching, in the preparation and marketing of poultry and in the breeding and raising of race horses, unless the undertaking is carried on as an additional part of other farming operations.

Coverage has also been extended to employment in landscape gardening and the maintenance of parks, gardens or grounds, whether in private or public ownership. It does not however include the employment of persons employed in nurseries, green houses or in vegetable farming.

Persons employed on a seasonal or temporary basis in these employments may still claim exception from the provisions of the unemployment insurance act by declaring that their livelihood is not ordinarily derived from the insurable employment.
