83rd Birthday Was Celebrated

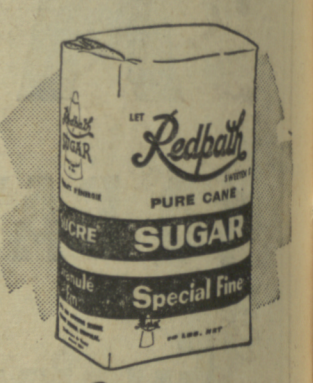
