**Tignish Legion Expands Centre**

TIGNISH — The Legion community centre at Tignish has expanded its building to 104 feet long by 47 feet wide under the winter works program.

The modern building that is 100 feet long by 33 feet wide and erected in 1952 will house a training room for cadets, billiard and card rooms, club rooms, TV room, meeting room and a two-lane bowling alley and washrooms in the basement.

There is a dance hall, ladies lounge, a modern kitchen and up-to-date canteen, store room, washrooms and washrooms on the ground floor with fluorescent lighting.

The second floor will be occupied by office space and living quarters for a janitor should the need arise.

The main entrance to the building will have two oversize doors 12½ by 9½ feet with tempered Herculite glass that will be installed by Pittsburgh Glass Co. of Moncton, N.B.

Arthur DesRoches, Legion president, is in charge of the project and Edward Tremblay is building foreman.

**Pa Kettle Dies At 76**

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Drawing Percy Kibridge, Pa Kettle to movie fans, died Friday, two months after he was injured in an auto accident. He was 76.

Kibridge, veteran of 800 stage roles before making his film debut in 1942, won his greatest fame while co-starring with Marjorie Main in seven films based on the characters Ma and Pa Kettle from The Egg and I, a novel made into a successful movie.

They played in slapstick fashion a rural couple with a large brood of children.

Last Sept. 17 he and a friend, actor Frank Belmont, 73, were struck by a car in a Hollywood intersection. Belmont was killed. Kibridge underwent brain surgery Nov. 11. Death was attributed to hardening of the arteries in the brain and to pneumonia.

A bachelor, Kibridge had lived alone on social security since retiring at 65. He spent much time walking Hollywood Boulevard. He lived alone in an apartment nearby.

**Good Hope Group Elects Officers**

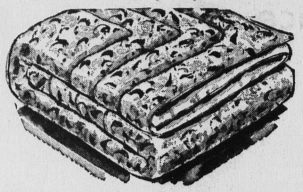

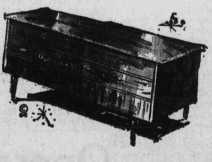

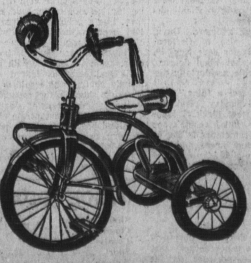
