WHAT'S IN A HOUSE

Floor Finishes Aid Appearance

FLOORING (1)
The first finishing job which makes the house livable is the flooring. The flooring and properly finished floors add a great deal to the appearance of the house. Prospective homeowners usually give considerable thought to the flooring to be installed in their new homes.

Both hardwood and tile floors collect less dirt and are easier to clean and polish if they are well laid and finished. There are many types of flooring. There is a type of flooring to suit about every taste and purpose. Some people insist on hardwood flooring, at least in the living and dining rooms, while others prefer resilient flooring in all rooms. Ceramic tile is popular for bathroom floors.

The main species of wood used for flooring are maple, birch and oak, all hardwood. Wood manufacturers grade their lumber according to quality and appearance. Top grade flooring is fairly uniform in color and is virtually free from defects. Medium grades may be just as serviceable but will contain some knots and blemishes and there will be a larger proportion of short pieces in every load. Mill-run flooring is a mixture of all unsorted grades exactly as it comes from the mill. Flooring grades for NHA-financed houses are specified in the book Residential Standards which is available at any CMHC office.

Because flooring is purposely dried out, care must be taken to keep it free of moisture. It should be nailed in place as soon as possible after delivery to the site. If the lumber contains too much moisture, wide spaces will appear between the boards following shrinkage. Flooring should never be stored in a house that has just been plastered, and if necessary, the heating system should be kept in operation between the time the lumber is delivered and the floor-laying job is completed.

FLOORING (2)
How, you may ask, is hardwood nailed in place? Special flooring nails are normally used to nail the flooring boards to the sub-floor. Nails are driven in at an angle through the tongue which runs along the edge of each board. This is called concealed nailing because the nail heads don't show when the next board is put in place.

Ceramic tiles are used mainly for bathroom floors and hallways. The important thing is to lay the tiles so that the finished floor surface is level with the floors in the adjoining rooms or hallway. Variations between floor levels are both annoying and dangerous.

Resilient flooring is a covering of composition tile or linoleum and is now standard for surfacing kitchen and bathroom floors. It is also frequently used in other parts of the house. This type of flooring is very easy to install.

Unless the sub-floor is made of plywood, and underlay will be required under resilient flooring. This underlay may be plywood or some other material which has proved satisfactory for the purpose.

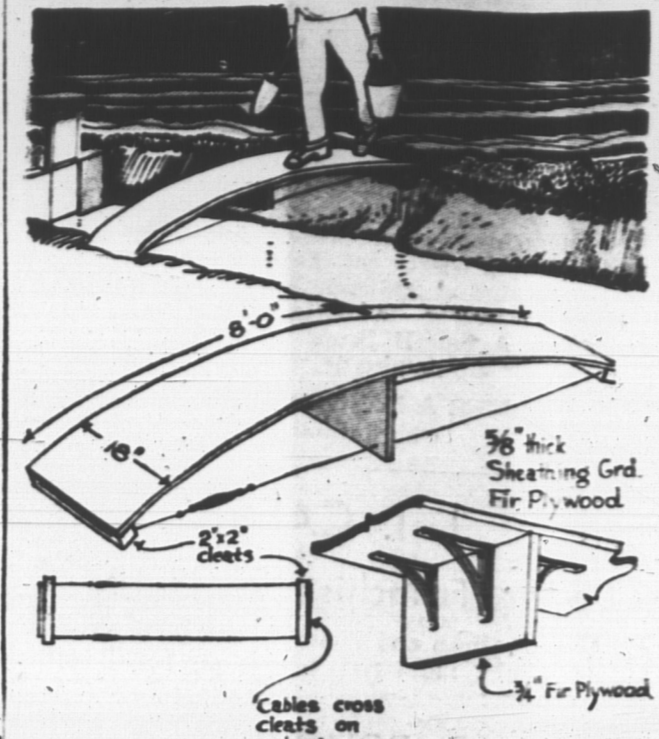
To avoid bumps in the floor, the joints between the underlay panels should be perfectly smooth. The slightest unevenness will eventually show up on the floor surface. Nail heads should be hammered down flush with the underlay or counter-sunk slightly.

A soundproof floor must be provided between the upper and lower units of a duplex dwelling.

NOISE IN WATER HEATER
QUESTION: We are having trouble with rumbling noises in the hot water heater in a fairly new home. What do you advise?
ANSWER: Your water is probably being heated to too hot a temperature, or too quickly. The temperature should be between 130 and 140 degrees for normal household use. Or the heating coil or knuckle connections slope downward instead of up, impeding the escape of steam from the tank.

PORTABLE PLYWOOD BRIDGE

Using the engineering principle of the bowstring arch this lightweight portable plywood bridge will support a man across a span of about eight feet. Waterproof glue sheathing grade fir plywood 5/8" thick must be used for the platform and a piece 3/4" thick for the centre stiffener. About 20 feet of stainless steel or similar cable and two heavy turn-buckles are required. It is wise to make the end buttens of oak or alternatively to face their outside edges with a metal strip to prevent the cables from cutting into the wood. Use heavy duty brackets as shown to keep the centre stiffeners at right angles to the deck. The bridge has proven useful for crossing irrigation ditches. Light battens may be nailed across the walking surface to provide traction.
