A PROCLAMATION

BY HIS HONOR

ROBERT HODGSON, Esquire,

*Administrator and Commander-in-Chief in and over
Her Majesty's Island Prince Edward, and the
Territories thereunto belonging, Chancellor, Vice*

WHEREAS the Government of this Island hath devolved upon me, agreeably to a Warrant under the Royal Sign Manual, dated at Balmoral, the Thirteenth day of September, 1859.

I have, therefore, thought fit, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Executive Council of this Island, to issue this Proclamation, hereby requiring and commanding all Officers, Civil and Military, in this Government, to continue in the regular and due execution of the Duties and Powers of their respective Offices.

And I do further require and command all and singular Her Majesty's Officers, Ministers, and loving subjects of this Island, and all others whom it may concern, to take due notice hereof, and to give their ready obedience accordingly.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of this Island, at Charlottetown, in the said Island, this Twenty-first day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and in the Twenty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.
