The legal notices, of course, are of large importance. But, after all, it is in the situations wanted, the help wanted, the wants in general, the boarding, the board wanted, the rooms for rent, and all these intimate necessities of the people, that a newspaper does an incalculable amount of good. NEWS NOTES.

Salt is so scarce in Central Africa that it sells for 40 cents a pound. A vegetable diet creates a constant craving for the mineral, and if it is not obtained, the sufferer becomes prostrated, and frequently shows signs of insanity.

Amidst the wars and rumors of war the fact that blood is being spilled in civil commotions in two of the countries of South America is scarcely noticed in the despatches. In Brazil, that land of great possibilities and so little achievements, a band of fanatics under the leadership of Antonio Conselheiro has given the Government troops so much trouble that a supreme effort has at last had to be undertaken to crush him. In Uruguay, too, some 20,000 rebels are under arms, with Gen. Saravia in command. He is said to be moving on Montevideo, and we may hear at any time of the overthrow of President Borda and his Government.

In the southern States there are nearly 100 endowed schools and colleges devoted to negro education. They represent an investment of nearly \$10,000,000, and are maintained at an annual expense of nearly \$4,000,000. A conservative estimate places the number of graduates during the last twenty years at \$30,000. Some of the northern newspapers assert that the men who furnish the money for the support of these schools should inquire what becomes of this army of negro graduates. The idea that an education is not its own reward but should be a means to an easy livelihood is not yet dissipated, but no doubt the proportion of graduates who fail to distinguish themselves as such will soon be as large among the Caucasians as among the negroes.

A special to the New York Herald says: The Peruvian Government will cease the coinage of silver after May 10, and will not permit the importation of any silver coin. Director Preston, of the United States mint, was officially advised to this effect last week. The decree provides that silver coinage shall be suspended, and that the mint shall cease to receive silver bullion. Silver soles, the Peruvian dollar, worth about ninety-three cents American money, converted into bullion for export shall not be brought back except as bullion. All importations of silver coin after May 10 shall be made exclusively at the port of Callao, and shall be delivered to the mint by the customs officer, to be melted into bars and then returned to the owners. It is stated that these new regulations are made to check, if possible, the rapid depreciation of Peruvian silver currency.
