MONTREAL (CP) — The U.S.
dollar closed Friday at a discount
of 3/4 per cent in terms of Canadian
funds, down 1.32. Pound

Toronto Stocks

TORONTO (CP) — The stock
market fluctuated throughout Friday's
session and closed in a
mixed condition. Light trading
was once again the rule as many
investors continued to refrain
from trading, waiting for a clear
international picture.

With refining oils leading the
way, the market opened higher
and appeared headed for a session
of strong prices but more
rumors from the Middle East
resulted in an abrupt halt of the
upward trend and prices began
levelling off at noon.

Hudson Bay and Noranda were
down about a point among senior
base metals but other seniors
showed little change and what
change there was, was mostly
downward. Cassiar and United
Kudjup dipped 30 cents among
lower-priced mines. Hoyle was off
25 cents. Other issues had losses
or gains no greater than 10 or 15
cents.

Western oils managed to add
one-half point to their index as
index stocks such as Calgary and
Edmonton, Central Leduc and
Canadian Atlantic recorded moderate
gains. Canadian Devonian
gained 25 cents while Canada
Southern Pete was off 15 cents.

N. Y. STOCKS

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock
market took its third consecutive
loss Friday as trading volume
tapered off to the slimmest of the
week.

Key stocks showed losses of
from fractions to about 2 points.
Aircrafts bucked the trend and
kept a good part of their gains de-
spite a general lowering of prices
near the close.

The Associated Press average of
60 stocks fell \$1.20 to \$178.90.
The most active stock was El
Paso Natural Gas, off 1/4 at 80
on 26,400 shares. Second most ac-
tive was U.S. Steel, off 1/4 at 70
on 24,900 shares.

Gulf Oil once again was in-
volved in heavy selling as it lost
2 1/4 as a result of the nervous sit-
uation in the Middle East. Stand-
ard Oil (New Jersey) was down
1/2 active turnover.

Boeing, Douglas Aircraft and
General Dynamics each rose 1/4
and United Aircraft 1/2.
Among the steels, Bethlehem
dropped 1 and Youngstown 1/4.

On the New York stock ex-
change, Aluminum Limited was
up 1/4 as was Canadian Pacific.
Distillers-Seagrams and Granby
Mining each were up and Hud-
son Bay Mining and International
Nickel were down fractions.
