A VISIT TO CHERRY ISLAND

Last Saturday afternoon we had the pleasure of visiting Cherry Island, in Cascumpec Bay, the property of Mr Robert Oulton. Mr. Chas. Dalton of this town having kindly invited us to visit the fox farm which is situated on Mr Oulton's property, we accepted with pleasure so amiable an invitation and 2 p. m. found us the hosts of Mr and Mrs Oulton. After having satisfied the inner man and formed acquaintance with our host's family, among whom were Mrs Capt. Spalding of Malden, Mass. and her two interesting children, we proceeded, accompanied by Mr Oulton, to the fox rancho, which is stationed about the center of the island. We may here mention that the island contains about 200 acres, 80 of which are under high state of cultivation. The rest of the island is covered with thick woods, and it is in the wooded part of the island that Messrs Dalton and Oulton (for Mr Chas Dalton is a shareholder of the fox farm) have erected a 13 feet high wire fence of fine poultry setting of about two acres square in which they have now a dozen beautiful black foxes. Arrived at the pen we quietly sat near and watched master Raynard gamboing as gayly and freely as if he were in a hundred miles square forest. This wire enclosure has been built at considerable expenses. A trench 15 inches wide and four feet deep has been dug and in this the first panel of wire has been placed, being solidly packed with stones and earth so as to make it impossible for the foxes to scratch their way out. Good strong cedar posts have been sunk at an equal distance of 8 feet from each other on which the netting has been fastened; the fence being therefore 17 feet high, four of which are in the ground and 13 above, a high sufficient to pre-

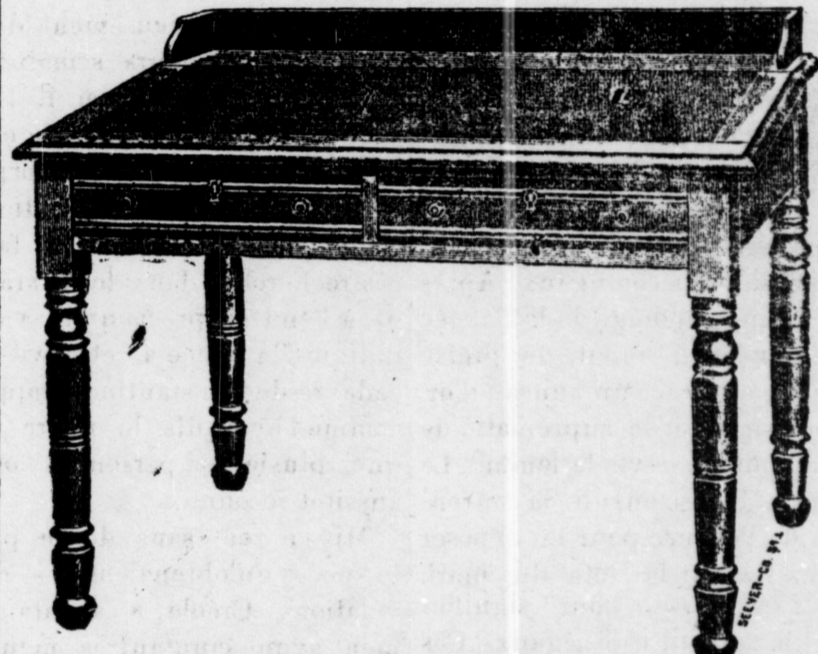
