with the thought of inviting the city of Charlottetown to name a representative to attend with him.

Speaking of the loan fund, Premier Shaw expressed the opinion "in the broad sense it is a good thing, but he foresees the possibility of municipalities going into projects which were not of an immediate nature, merely to share in the available funds. He wondered if such borrowing by them from the municipalities not have to have provincial approval."

The Premier did not wish to fully discuss the ramifications of the proposed loan fund until he had learned more about it, but he did anticipate the need for definite control "to keep projects within the limits of reason and commonsense."

However, he did express the hope that the municipalities would find that "back of it is probably the spectre of unemployment."

ITEMS WHICH IS SCHEDULED TO COME UP FOR DISCUSSION.

The Premier, in an oblique reference to the position of Quebec's Premier Jean Lesage, said: "we are not worrying too much about provincial rights. I don't feel any such co-operation as we are willing to give is any sacrifice of provincial rights."

Tourist Facilities Explored For '64

Prince Edward Island will be able to handle 10,000 visitors during 1964. This was revealed at the weekly press conference of the P.E.I. Centennial Committee yesterday morning.

However, the committee has not yet determined the number of daily visitors. This will be known next week, the committee is being prepared to meet the situation should the study show more visitors expected than the island is prepared to handle.

Should such a situation develop, the committee is prepared to stage an advertising campaign asking visitors to open up their homes and spare rooms for visitors.

If the situation became extremely tense, accommodations would be provided.

Such a situation is not being anticipated, "but we must be prepared," said Alan Holman, chairman of the financial committee.

To avoid overtaxing accommodations, the committee has been attempting to have converted a number of vacant houses some 75 - spread thly over the year. The last two weeks of July and all of August, the peak tourist period, have been kept open for tourists.

William Hayward, general manager of the committee and Mr. Birville, have been travelling the island for the past several weeks visiting various communities where potential events are being planned, and report a greater interest than had been the case earlier.

The committee has provided a special guide for these communities.
