Six starters came to the wire for the fourth race on the card. George Washington, Uscita Britton and Calumet Emerald headed the field for the first three-quarters of the race. From here on Uscita Britton uncorked a burst of speed that carried her around George Washington; Calumet Emerald coming up and passed the Washington horse but could not get by Uscita Britton who flashed under the wire with a head to spare; Calumet Emerald second, George Washington third, Nellie Gray who was acting badly fourth; Leland fifth and Rosebud sixth.

2.21 Trot and Pace

Seven starters answered the bell for the first heat with Squire Hanover a big favorite. After five scores Miss Jo Hanover who had the pole went away in first position with Squire Hanover trailing, and Bebe McElwain third. Going around the first turn Squire Hanover made a break and was passed by Bebe McElwain. The order remained unchanged right up to the three-quarter mark. All the horses were bunched but Miss Victoria, not counted as a factor in the race, put on a dazzling burst of speed from there on to just tip Bebe McElwain at the wire. June Evans beat out Squire Hanover for third place with Miss Jo Hanover, Millie Kalmuck and Annie Chan finishing fifth, sixth and seventh.
