Steel Was Business Feature in Canada During Last Week

Steel, the dominant force in the economy, was the feature on the Canadian business scene last week.

Steel Country's "big steel" announced plans to produce experimental use of fuel oil in one of its blast furnaces at its huge Hamilton complex.

The move will make the company the first steel producer in North America to combine both natural gas and oil in ironmaking operations. The company is currently the only Canadian producer using natural gas as a blast furnace fuel to supplement coke.

C. M. Birkett, manager of the Hamilton works, said the company's decision to experiment with oil will in no way decrease its use of gas in the foreseeable future.

LOOKING AHEAD
"We are more than satisfied with the results of natural gas injection but great technological changes are taking place in our industry and we cannot afford to stand pat in any operation."

Mr. Birkett said that some of the greatest changes in steel-making techniques achieved in the last few years have occurred in blast furnace operations and "the end is not yet in sight."

One of the major breakthroughs achieved by Stelco has been its ability to produce efficient iron for greatly expanded production of steel without building new blast furnaces and cokemaking facilities involving heavy capital expenditure.

U.S. Orders For Steel Remain High

CLEVELAND (AP)—U.S. steelmakers may avoid a December drop in shipments if they continue booking new orders at the current rate, the magazine Steel says.

December shipments have averaged four per cent under November in four of the last six years.

Many steelmakers who originally expected November shipments to drop slightly are predicting they will ship as much tonnage this month as they did in October, the national metalworking weekly says.

Steel ingot production is expected to rise this week for the fifth straight time. The publication looks for production to be higher than the 1,950,000 tons it estimated the industry poured last week. Operations now are close to 65 per cent of unofficial capacity—highest since mid-July.

Boycotts Asked By Separatists

MONTREAL (CP)—A Quebec separatist movement has called for a boycott against a Toronto-owned brewery and another movement is threatening similar action against two French automobile firms.

The Rassemblement pour l'Indépendance Nationale and the Parti Québécois in separate statements.

Both called for intervention by the Quebec government in the separatist movements.

The Rassemblement called for a boycott by French-speaking Canadians against all products of Dow Brewery Limited, controlled by Canadian Breweries Limited of Toronto.

The movement was aroused by the firm's new Kebe brand beer featuring a blue and white label similar in design to Quebec's provincial flag, the fleur de lys.

The Parti Québécois said Quebecers should boycott the Renault and Peugeot cars if the two firms set up plants in Ontario, instead of Quebec.

The two firms were said to be considering establishment of Canadian plants.

But Rassemblement described the new beer label as "the worst insult ever perpetrated by the Toronto capitalists" and said the Quebec government should take steps to ensure "our national symbols are not exploited for commercial purposes."

In its statement, Le Parti Québécois said "Quebecers are waiting to see what the provincial government does" in the "Peugeot-Renault affair."

The party said Quebecers buy seven of every 10 cars the two firms sell in Canada and added Quebec "urgently needs industry to absorb unemployment."

Runaway Cars Blamed For Mine Blast

TOKYO, Japan (Reuters)—The authorities have tentatively blamed runaway coal cars for sparking the 451-death Kyushu coal mine explosion Saturday.

Their investigation into the mine's disaster against a background of nation-wide "protest meetings" called by the coal miners' union because of the alleged inadequate safety precautions.

Premier Hayato Ikeda ordered the inquiry into the explosion and another investigation of a triple train wreck near Yokohama Saturday in which 163 persons died and 96 were hurt.

Police and mine security investigators did not know what caused a chain coupling connecting two cars to a Japanese coal conveyor to break.

But, according to a Kyushu national news agency Kyodo, the investigators were sure that runaway coal cars had dust blown up into the air by the wind pressure of the runaway cars.

UN Group Asks New Arms Talks

UNITED NATIONS (AP)—The UN General Assembly's main political committee has approved a call for new disarmament talks in Geneva with the aim of reducing risks of war.

Without a recorded vote, the 111-nation committee accepted a resolution setting out guidelines for the 18-nation disarmament commission expected to convene in Geneva early in 1964.

Yanks To Reduce Viet Nam Force

SAIGON (AP)—The exodus of 1,000 U.S. servicemen being withdrawn from South Viet Nam will start Dec. 3, Maj. Gen. Charles A. Timmes announced Friday. All are to be out by the year end, reducing the American contingent to about 15,000.

By coincidence Timmes' announcement came after the winding of the bloodiest week in the long war between Communist Viet Cong guerrillas and U.S.-backed government troops.

Communist attacks on hamlets, outposts and patrols in the seven days ended Wednesday cost the government 383 casualties—the highest number ever killed, wounded and captured in a single week. Communist losses were estimated at 750 weapons while losing only 149.

Two Hunters Given Blame In Accidents

MANIWAKI, Que. (CP)—Two Ottawa district hunters have been held criminally responsible for the death of two other hunters in separate accidents near this town 90 miles north of the national capital.

In Hull, Que., Pierre Tache, a lawyer retained by the hunters, said he expects charges will be laid in view of the inquest verdicts rendered recently.

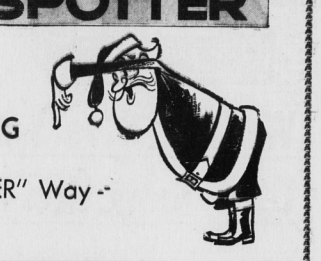
