

Hockey Panthers Break Record; but Lose to Acadia

Acadia University handed the University of Prince Edward Island Panthers their first loss of the season with a 6-5 victory in Atlantic University Athletic Association hockey action in Wolfville, Nova Scotia, Sunday.

The Panthers went into the game fresh from a win over the Dalhousie Tigers which gave the Panthers the record for most consecutive wins without a loss, previously held by the Saint Mary's Huskies back in 1978.

Greg Rowe and Todd Land each scored two goals for Acadia, who led 3-2 after the first period and replied with three more to take a 6-2 lead after two periods of play.

Craig Kitchener and Bob Caldwell each scored one goal. Danny Revell scored twice for the Panthers while Ron Carragher, Greg Gravel and Randy Muttart scored one goal each for UPEI, who slipped to the number two spot in the nation with the loss behind the University of Alberta.

Saturday in Halifax (at the record-breaking game), Greg Gravel scored three goals to pace the Panthers to their fourteenth victory. Gordie Roche, Ron Carragher and Darwin McCutcheon scored one for UPEI which led 2-1 after the first period and 5-3 after the second period.

The Panthers' record now stands at 14-1; they are in

first place in the AUAA hockey conference with 28 points, followed by the Universite de Moncton Blue Eagles (12-0-1) with 23 points.

UPEI has two very important games this weekend at the Forum, as they face the Mount Allison Mounties (4-8) Saturday and the Moncton Blue Eagles Sunday at the Forum.

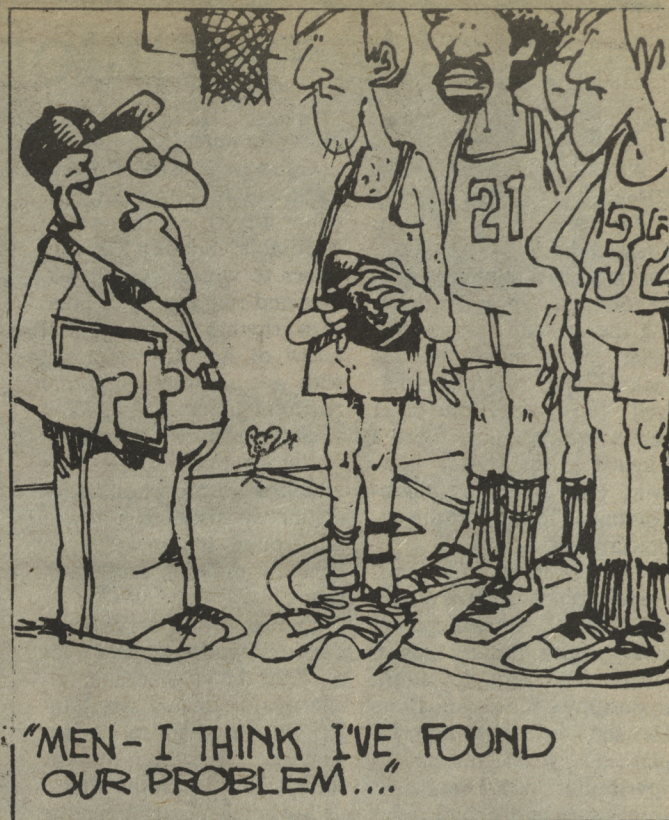
The UPEI-Moncton matchup could very well be one of the very best college contests in the country, as Moncton is ranked fourth in the nation by the CIAU and nips at the heels of the number two ranked Panthers.

There should be a sell-out crowd to watch the two teams

battle, and the game should be very fast with some outstanding hockey skills on display.

Willock ripped down 11 rebounds in each game and at 6'5" is one of the top pivot men in the AUAA.

A keen sense of the game, quickness around the basket and a tremendous vertical jump are Trevor's main attributes.

Trevor is also from Toronto and he is in his second year at UPEI.
