Resolution Re Ferry Service

The following is an official release issued by Mr. R. K. Clements, president of the King's County Board of Trade, regarding a brief presented to the board from Georgetown dealing with the question of ferry service between Georgetown and Pictou.

"At a special meeting of the King's County Board of Trade held on April 19, for the consideration of the necessity of an improved ferry service to Nova Scotia, we are unanimously agreed that the present duration of the ferry service at Wood Island is much too short to take care of the fastly increasing car and truck traffic. We can see no good reason why this boat could not continue operations until Jan. 1 or later, and begin again April 1, or some years even earlier.

"We strongly recommend that the new ferry be so built that when the season at Wood Island ends to be determined by ice conditions—she proceed to Georgetown-Pictou run. It would be necessary to have wing aprons only at these two ports for loading and unloading, and we are sure that the traffic would warrant this expenditure."

Copies of the above resolution have been forwarded to the proper authorities.
