The heirs of the Lusignans, Dukes of Cyprus, who purchased that island from Richard I. of England, and governed it for about three centuries, till dispossessed by the Venetians, have filed their claim to the sovereignty of the island in the British Foreign Office. They are described by an English paper as: Lomo of Lusignan, a serene highness, prince royal of Cyprus, Jerusalem and Armenia, who lives in St. Petersburg, and seems to be recognized there; and his nephews, Guy de Lusignan, prince royal of Cyprus, Jerusalem and Armenia, a man of gentle and distinguished bearing, who lives in a modest mansion in the Avenue d'Avlan, Paris, and is preparing his son to enter the French Navy, and Korene Nar Bey, Prince of Lusignan, archbishop of Beshiktash, Constantinople. The last named represented Armenia at Berlin during the Conference.

The telegraphers have been recording for some time the fact the Bosnians have strongly resisted the occupation of their territory by the Austrians. This is explained by a correspondent of the London Times, who states that very few Bosnians have ever heard of the Berlin Congress or its decisions, and knew nothing beyond the fact that foreigners had invaded their country. He says that if the Austrians had first occupied the districts along the Save, where the population knew them, and where they were not opposed by a single shot, and then waited until the inland populations had fully understood the objects of the occupation by means of natives sent from the occupied territory into the interior, and from visitors from the latter to the former, there would in all probability have been no opposition to the movement of the Austrian troops.

From New York comes an account of a ball in the Bowery got up by the pickpockets, burglars, and shoplifters of the city, in order to fee counsel for one of their number now in jail on a charge of being a masked burglar. Five hundred tickets at fifty cents each were sold, an additional charge of 10 cents being levied on all the "gentlemen" who had hats.

The steamship Great Eastern has, it is said, been purchased by a company, who intend using her as a cattle boat to ply between Texas and London. She is now being fitted out at Milford Haven, and is to have new engines and boilers, manufactured by the Clyde Iron Works, at a cost of \$500,000. Refrigerators will be built in her for the purpose of carrying fresh beef. It is estimated that she will carry 2,200 head of cattle and 3,000 head of mutton.

Charles P. Stickney, the latest defaulter that Fall River has furnished, was one of the most popular and most implicitly trusted men in that city. He had been a member of the State Senate, and was looked upon as a future candidate for Congress. He lived in the most pretentious house in Fall River, and entertained in royal style. His fall has so affected him that he is now lying completely prostrated, with little prospect of recovery.
