Growing Issues Discussed By President Of Venezuela

Venezuela is a country where democratic government has come to grips with both communism and right dictatorship. Under Romulo Betancourt's leadership it has staved off the excesses of both extremes. Now, amid bursts of terrorism, it is heading toward a new election. Its problems and progress—and the problems facing Latin America as a whole—are discussed in this exclusive interview with President Betancourt.

CARACAS (AP) — Romulo Betancourt lashed a brown leather desk cover with his shabby forefinger and spoke in bursts of urgent, forceful, Spanish.

The Communist threat in Latin America is real, but we cannot believe that only repressive measures against Communists are sufficient," said the Venezuelan president.

"We must combat poverty, poor distribution of wealth and undemocratic structures of Latin American economies.

"The effort in this decade to face these problems is decisive."

He stopped, clenched his hands together and thought for a moment.

"The experience of Venezuela demonstrates it can be done."

At 53 Betancourt has run a democratic government in Venezuela 4 1/2 years. To keep it going he has fought Communists and right-wing terrorists alike. He has built schools, homes and hospitals and introduced land reforms. He has started to clean up massive city slums and to diversify industry and agriculture.

Today, nearing the end of his elected term, Betancourt is obviously convinced that Venezuela's achievements prove that battles with communism and rightist dictatorship in the hemisphere can be won. But he is the first to recognize that the struggle is still far from over in Venezuela or elsewhere.

KNOWS DANGERS

Better than most men, Betancourt appreciates the dangers that lie ahead, for he has been both ruler and revolutionary.

Betancourt discussed Venezuelan and inter-American problems in an interview with the Associated Press in his office in Miraflores Palace.

A stocky, dynamic man who speaks insistently and gestures frequently, he has a reputation for courage, honesty, idealism and a wily sense of politics.

The red scars on his hands came from burns he suffered in 1960 in a bomb attack that nearly killed him. The attack was the work of right-wing terrorists, backed by the Trujillo dictatorship then ruling the Dominican Republic. Betancourt was an implacable enemy of rightist Trujillo just as he is an enemy of Cuba's leftist Fidel Castro.

In the streets of Caracas a Communist terror campaign that has gripped the nation for years continues. Troops guard strategic buildings and seal off some old sections of the town. Heavily armed police patrol the business district in pairs.

Betancourt expresses confidence that despite the terrorism national elections will be held on schedule Dec. 1 and a new government will take office in March.

DEPLORES AID CUTS

Betancourt said he favors greater participation by Latin American governments in the U.S.-supported Alliance for Progress aid program for Latin America. He deplored cuts in U.S. foreign aid by Congress. If present cuts in U.S. foreign aid stand, he said, the total U.S. aid for Latin America will be little more than the al-

Three Hundred Torontonians Make Move To Quit Smoking

TORONTO (CP)—Three hundred Torontonians are having a horrible day on a liquid-heavy diet, a warm-bath-and-walking regimen and a routine in which they probably have to struggle to keep from snoring at spouses, children and work-mates.

The edgy 300 are voluntary adherents to a pledge made at a public meeting here Sunday night: "I choose to quit smoking," starting with a strict five-day routine designed to lift them over the worst of the withdrawal symptoms.

E. E. Duncan, pastor of College Park Seventh Day Adventists Church in Oshawa, Ont., is conducting his fourth five-day plan. If his present class matches the form of past pledge takers, 210 of the 300 will emerge from the routine as confirmed non-smokers.

The rules call for getting out of bed half an hour earlier than usual, taking a bath or shower, drinking two glasses of lukewarm water followed by a bowl of fruit and then going for a walk before work.

The diet during the day is restricted to fruit or fruit juice, washed down by half-dozen glasses of water, milk or ovaltine.

Each evening during the five-day plan they attend a meeting and get additional moral support by choosing a partner for mutual sympathy and encouragement.

Before bed, another walk, another warm bath and, if insomnia strikes, a tablespoon of honey in warm water.

Even if the fruit, the water, the walks, the baths and the honey have nothing directly to do with assisting withdrawal, the hopefuls are likely to be so busy observing the rules they won't have time to light up

CNR Freight Rates Cut

A new freight rate has lowered the costs of shipping in the Maritimes and Central Canada by 14 cents, Doug Lacombe public relations manager, Monday announced yesterday.

The new tariffs offer lower charges than the current less-than-carload rates on west-bound shipments moving from the Maritimes and Eastern Quebec to Montreal.

Reductions also apply on inbound shipments as far east as Amherst, N.S. Beyond that point the current rates at many places are cheaper than the new ones, and it is presumed shippers would continue to use their instead of the express freight tariffs, the dispatch said.
