So what exactly makes a Canadian dictionary Canadian? Katherine Barber, editor-in-chief for Oxford University Press' new foray into language will be addressing this question at a special public presentation at 8:00 pm on the evening of Friday, November 10 at the Prince Edward Hotel. She will be looking for likely additions to the new dictionary from the audience, so everyone is invited to bring along their favourite Canadianisms.

Ms Barber will be taking part in the Annual General meeting of the Atlantic provinces Linguistics Association in Charlottetown on November 10th and 11th. The theme of the meeting is Making Linguistics Accessible. Workshop topics range from the general usefulness of linguistics for teachers or professionals who do auditory testing of children, to gender-related discussions on the use of words such as homosexual, Ms, and the wider issues of sexism and sexual harassment.

The program is designed to be of interest to the general public as well as linguists and anyone can take part in the sessions. 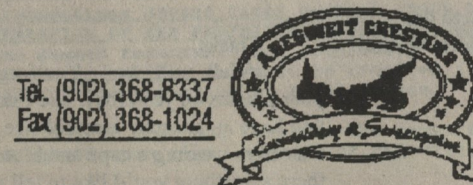
