NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market Tuesday wiped out a substantial part of its big recovery of last week. Unconfirmed rumors of peace overtures by North Viet Nam accompanied the decline.

Trading was moderate, volume totalling 5,770,000 shares compared with 4,790,000 Friday.

The Dow Jones industrial average fell 12.97 to 884.07, its largest loss since May 9.

Losses ranging from 6 to 10 points or less were taken by many electronics, color television, aerospace and airlines issues.

Declines of 1 to 4 points were registered also by key stocks represented in the averages.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks fell 4.3 to 320.4.

Standard and Poor's 500-stock index dropped 1.20 to 86.13.

Gold mining issues bucked the trend as they usually do in a declining market.

IBM announced a price of \$228 a share for its new offering of shares to stockholders at the rate of one share for every 40 held and fell 8 1/2 to 362 1/4.

Some Canadian mining stocks went up sharply. McIntyre Porcupine rose 2 1/2, Dome Mines 1 1/4, and Hudson Bay Mining 1/4.

Canadian Pacific was up 1/4 and Distillers Seagrams 5/8. Granby Mining lost 1/8, Alcan 3/4, and International Nickel 1/4.

On the American Stock Exchange, Scurry Rainbow fell 1 1/2, Preston Mines gained 1/4. What stocks did.
