TEMPERATURE CONTROL

The second method involves careful control of storage temperatures. This can be done by using the household refrigerator (for one pot), an old refrigerator placed in the basement for quite a few pots, or a cold room—check the temperatures in various parts of it with a thermometer to see if it will do (keeping a basement window open at night will sometimes cool it off sufficiently). In this method, store the

bulbs dry in open quart baskets or open paper bags, labeled as to kind of bulb, variety and date stored. Store your hyacinths, which respond the fastest, at 63 degrees for four weeks in the dark. Then pot them and store the bulbs in pots at 55 degrees. When the growth shoot emerges 1/4 inches or more out of the neck of the bulb, move the pots as you want them to bloom into the bright light (sunny window sill or under fluorescent lights) at 65 degrees. They'll bloom in about one month.

Store your tulip bulbs dry and labelled at 45 degrees, daffodils at 50 degrees, for 12 weeks or more in the dark. As you want them to start growing, pot the bulbs and bring them to bright light and a temperature of 60 degrees. They'll bloom in about a month.

With either method, plant only one kind of bulb, and only one named variety in each pot to ensure bloom at the same time. Exhibition-size hyacinths look well one to a pot; tulips look better with three or more in a container, and with daffodils, suit yourself but plant as many as you can get in your container.

SETTING BULBS
Bulbs do better planted as close together as you can get them without actually having the bulbs touch each other. Set tulips on the flat side of the bulb so the large lower leaf will hang over the pot to reveal the bloom. The kind of soil you use is unimportant so long as it neither stays waterlogged a long time nor dries out too fast. Clay pots are generally more satisfactory in larger sizes, plastic in smaller sizes. It is not necessary to fertilize the bulbs at any time unless you grow them on after flowering to fatten them for outside paining the next fall (they won't force successfully again indoors).

Many women gardeners like to grow hyacinths in bowls or glasses of water. Add bits of charcoal to keep the water sweet. The water level can be kept high enough to touch the bulb at first; let it drop as roots develop until it is 1/4-inch below the bulb. Both bulb and glass should be kept in the dark at 55 degrees (try refrigerator) until the growth shoot is about 2 1/2 inches long. Then move the container to bright light and cool (60 to 65 degrees) temperature to flower. You can avoid long foliage and floppy flower stems by keeping temperatures cold and the light bright.

First Aid For Ailing Houses

FIXING ROCKER ARM
The arm of my old platform rocker has come off. I tried gluing it, but it doesn't hold. What kind of glue should I buy, or where can I have it fixed?
ANSWER: Possibly you didn't scrape the old glue off the end of the arm, or from the inside of the hole where it fitted. New glue doesn't stick very well over old; same idea as paint won't stick over a greasy surface. The best piece of discarded nylon stocking is wonderful as padding. The epoxy-type adhesives have tremendous holding power, and are now on sale at just about every hardware and houseware store.

"NATURAL" FINISH SIDING
QUESTION: We recently bought an older house (20 years old) which is finished in linseed oil tinted with raw umber. The exterior now looks as if it needs to be refinished. 1. Is linseed oil a good preservative for the exterior of a house (the wood siding is imitation log)? 2. Can linseed oil be painted over? 3. Is this linseed oil finish attractive to honey bees (we have bees in one wall)?
ANSWER: Linseed oil is OK, but it will darken woods like redwood and cedar considerably. It tends also to mildew faster than marine varnish. Yes, you can paint over linseed oil. To the best of my knowledge, it is not unduly attractive to bees. Caution: If you use linseed oil, be sure to wipe off all excess after about 30 minutes, and

let it dry thoroughly. Without vigorous wiping, the surface will be sticky.
MAKE WALNUT LIGHTER
QUESTION: We just bought a second hand, 10-year-old walnut dining table and chairs. The legs of the table are of a darker walnut than the set. Is there any way to get the sun bleached table top back to original color without refinishing?
ANSWER: I know of no other way to lighten the walnut except bleaching. This naturally requires removing the finish first. So you'd have to refinish when our bleaching process was done. (If any reader knows any way to shorten this process I am sure we'd all appreciate hearing about it!)

wood turns a soft gray. In doors, left without any finish treatment, the wood mellows to a slightly deeper tone with the years.
Applying one or two coats of clear, dull white lacquer (kind used to cover wallpaper) to the clean redwood surfaces will do perceptible change in original color. For a slight shine, apply one or two thin coats of top quality paste wax, buffing well after each application.

CLEANING SHINGLES
QUESTION: Our house has wood trim. We painted the trim and would like to clean the siding to make it look brighter. How can this be done?
ANSWER: Wash the shingles with a detergent, or a proportion of one-half cup of trisodium phosphate to the gallon of hot water. Then rinse with plenty of clear water to remove all trace of the cleaning solution. Be careful to keep the

Council find that ceramic tile, cement tile, linoleum and vinyl are the floor materials easiest to maintain. Also that designs with dark and light colors, show soil less than solid colors. Two Springs A Year For Home Gardeners
