## Hearings Slated By Labor Board

Declining to reveal the type of trades involved, Charles R. McQuaid, chairman of the provincial labor relations board said yesterday that further

hearings are planned into a request by the group for exemption from the minimum wage rates for male employees.

## The board has already met once with representatives of the employees and tonight a further meeting with the same people is scheduled and on Oct. 3 a meeting will be held with representatives of the employing firms.

The employee group apparently feels that its work requires a certain amount of skill and

training and for that reason should be exempt from the provincial minimum wage rate of 90 cents per hour so that the group's minimum rate of pay could be set higher.
