THE TEACHERS' CONVENTION.

The Teachers' Convention met this forenoon in the Philharmonic Hall. Mr. Kiely, Vice President for Queen's County, presided. Mr. McIntyre, of Summerside, being at present ill with typhoid fever. After routine business, Mr. McSwain gave a very practical talk on the study of natural history. He showed how the Botanical Society of Canada, before collecting and dispersing information through all parts of the Dominion did much to stimulate so important a study. Having finished at noon, discussion on his paper was laid over.

In connection with the convention there will be a public meeting at 7.30 this evening. Governor Howland, Rev. G. M. Campbell and Rev. Dr. Mar, will give addresses. Doors open at 7
