Mr. McCurdy told of the events which led to his taking up residence in Baddeck, Cape Breton, where the speaker first made his acquaintance.

"My early recollections of Dr. Bell were in his laboratory during the days when he was experimenting with the gramophone, concerning which he was the inventor of the wax record which gave this instrument commercial possibility. I will remember the many records of native Gaelic tunes and the reproduction of these was a constant source of interest, mystery and joy to the inhabitants of that district."

It was following Dr. Bell's interest in the flight of birds and the investigation of surfaces and propellers that the "Aerial Experiment Association" was formed. "A name, I think," said Mr. McCurdy, "will live in the aeronautical world for some time."

Following experimentation with kites and gliders, a powered plane was built and flew for the first time on February 23rd, 1909, with the speaker as the pilot. This flight turned out to be the first flight by a heavier-than-air machine in the British Empire.

After Dr. Bell's death, the Hon. Mr. McCurdy concluded, he was buried at the top of his own mountain in the midst of that Scottish scenery which he learned to love in Cape Breton.

**Labor Income**

OTTAWA, Nov. 29 (CP) — Canadian labor's income hit another all-time high in August, the Bureau of Statistics announced today.

Besides touching a monthly peak, income for the first eight months of the year was more than \$1,000,000,000 up from the corresponding period last year.

The eight-month total was \$6,236,000,000, compared with \$5,326,000 in January-August, 1950.

For August alone, the figure was \$839,000,000, up \$3,000,000 from the previous peak in July. It compared with \$699,000,000 in August, 1950.

SINGAPORE, Nov. 30 (Friday) — (AP)—The Bangkok radio said early today that a cabinet shake-up has occurred in Thailand but Premier P. Pibulsonggram remains in power. The radio broadcast made no mention of a coup, but unconfirmed reports circulated here that army and navy leaders had forced a shakeup on the eve of the arrival from Switzerland of King Rama IX and his Queen, Sirikit.

**Prominent Georgetown Man Dies**

The death occurred in the Prince Edward Island Hospital, Charlottetown, on Wednesday, November 29th, of Mr. Ashley W. Allen of Georgetown, in his 76th year.

The late Mr. Allen was born in Georgetown and resided here during all of his lifetime. For years he was a successful, independent fisherman and in the late nineteen-thirties, he bought the general store, stock and goodwill of Mr. J. A. MacKinnon, on the corner of Richmond and Kent Streets.

He carried on a successful business at this location until several years ago, when he moved his store to his property on the corner of Water and Victoria Streets, where he continued to do business.

In former years he served for several terms as secretary of the Georgetown High School. He leaves to mourn, his widow, the former Margaret Johnson. Funeral services will be held from his residence on Friday, November 30th at 2:00 P. M.
