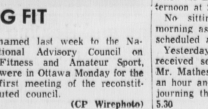

Weather Blocks Sealing By Air

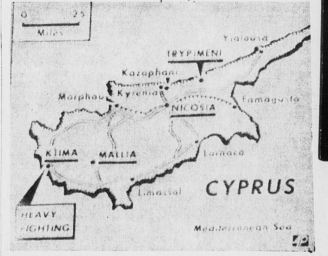
HALIFAX (CP)—Airborne sealing operations in the Gulf of St. Lawrence were blocked by weather Monday because of heavy fog and rain.
