Realizing on the Stamps Idea.

Some Cold Storage Facilities Provided.

OTTAWA, September 15.—Post Master Mulock will make a quarter of a million dollars by the jubilee stamps idea.

The Department of Trade is informed that cold storage facilities have been provided aboard one of the vessels running from Halifax to Jamaica. This means that Canadian exporters of butter and cheese will be able to ship to the West Indies.

THE INDIAN UPRISING.

Movements of General Biggs.

One Sepoy Killed and Five Wounded.

SIMLA, September 15.—General Biggs is advancing along the Samanaac Ridge to the relief of Fort Gulestan. He found the enemy entrenched in force in the Gosra Hills. The third Gurkha regiment stormed the position, and one Sepoy was killed and five wounded. General Biggs has relieved the Sanger outposts attacked. The enemy is visibly strong at Saraghari. It is feared that flushed with success they may attack Fort Gulestan and the forces in the garrison will be unable to hold out till General Biggs arrives.

Gigantic Wheat Combine.

WINNIPEG, Sept. 15.—The Tribune charges that a gigantic combination has been formed by the grain dealers of the province by which dealers, millers and grain syndicates will keep down the price of wheat. The paper also charges that the banks have joined in and agreed not to assist any buyer who does not join.

LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL.

LONDON, Sept. 13.—It is reported that the Duchess of York will shortly issue an appeal for the Irish, who are threatened with famine, similar to the appeal made by the Princess of Wales in behalf of the London poor at the time of the preparations for the Queen's jubilee celebration.

PORT SAID, Sept. 13.—The British steamer Polphemus, from Bokohama to London, has been damaged in a collision near Jebel-Tar, and island of the Red Sea according to a despatch just received from the Island of Perim. Twenty-seven of the crew were drowned.

FREDERICTON, Sept. 13.—The Fredericton deaf and dumb institution was totally destroyed by fire this evening. The department was unable to render much assistance as the institution is beyond the fire limit. The loss is a very serious one.

SEATTLE, Wash., Sept. 13.—Sulphur Creek, a branch of Dominion Creek, which is a tributary of the Indian River, is the scene of the latest gold excitement in the Klondyke. From accounts of the new district brought down on the schooner South Coast, it seems that the diggings will rival even the famous Bonanza and Eldorado. Gold was found just below the surface running \$34 to the pan. Two men got out \$300 in a day by simply prospecting their claims. A stampede followed the reports of the new finds which reached Dawson City, Aug. 15. In a week 500 men had crossed the mountains between Eldorado and Dominion Creek. They travelled day and night and in two weeks the whole stream was staked out.

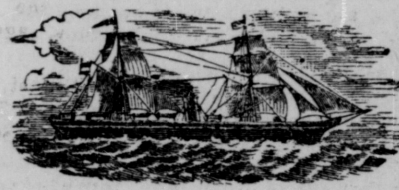
