Gov't Sells 25 Million Pounds Surplus Butter

OTTAWA (CP)—The government has disposed of some 25,000,000 pounds of 1955 butter to Canadian dealers at 56 cents a pound—two cents below the support price, agricultural officials said Tuesday.

This reduces the government-held surplus by roughly half, but it involves a large loss to the federal treasury of about \$1,250,000. This loss includes the sale at two cents a pound below the government's purchase price of 58 cents, as well as storage and freight charges which average roughly about three cents a pound. This makes a total loss of five cents a pound.

The government now sells butter to Canadian hospitals and other institutions at about 40 cents a pound. Last year some 16,000,000 pounds were exported, mostly to Communist countries at a price of between 37 and 39 cents a pound.

Officials said they have no plans to negotiate export deals this year.

TORONTO (CP)—A ripple of profit-taking trickled through the stock market Tuesday and eased prices lower in faster trading. Although most changes in all sections of the market were fractional, a few issues recorded gains of more than one point and Falconbridge, in senior base metals, advanced \$2.75 to \$37.

Hudson Bay gained 1/2 among senior base metals, but most other stocks showed losses. International Nickel dropped 1 1/2 and Noranda was off 1/2. Procter & Gamble, Kilmbe Copper and Nickel Rim gained 15 cents or more among juniors.

Algonquin gained 1/2 in uranium but Gumar was off 1/2. Rare Earth added 15 cents and Pater 13 cents for a new high of \$1. Great Plains featured western oils, gaining 1/2. Prairie Oil was up 15 cents.

TORONTO (CP)—Despite light receipts all slaughter cattle trading was very slow on all classes at prices steady to Monday's decline at the Ontario public stockyards today. The quality was only fair.

Papers were mixed, Int. International ahead one point and consolidated up 1/2 while Great Lakes, Powell River and Price all eased one point. Stocks were softer in a 1/2-point range.

McCull tacked on 1/2 but other issues were unchanged in the refining oils. Mines and western oils were mixed in a 10 cent range.
