Under these circumstances, there appeared nothing about continental free trade, commercial union or unrestricted reciprocity. The Premier announced the tariff; they denounced the Government. They said they wanted some change in the tariff, although they were not satisfied with the tariff as they were, and they finally passed a stirring resolution, not only to put us out of office, but to go about this country from end to end, declaring that every evil which men suffer and a country can endure is a fault of the Government and its fiscal policy.

Now, gentlemen, I have told you as good as I have admitted, at the outset, that the tariff requires changes, and that investigations are going forward towards that end. The public works of this country have been, perhaps largely, certainly liberally, dealt with in the past, and in the immediate future there would be no great demand for the increasing of public works to any very large degree.

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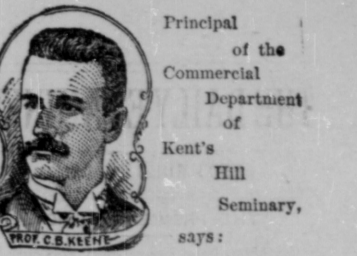
