

# Contract Awarded For New RCAF Tower Building

OTTAWA, (Special) - A new control tower building is to be erected at the R.C.A.F. station, Summerside, at a cost of \$84,000, the Defense Construction Limited announced Friday. The contract has been awarded to County Construction Company Limited, of Charlottetown. Work will start almost immediately, and the project is in line with plans for improvement to the air station. An official of defense construction explained that the tower building will be equipped with a standard combined receiver-transmitter and outside services. It will be 36 by 16 feet and 12 feet high. It will be built of prefabricated steel locks, have concrete slabs, and have an insulated interior finish.

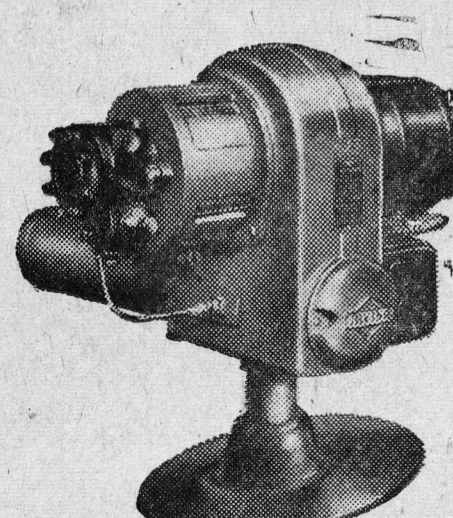
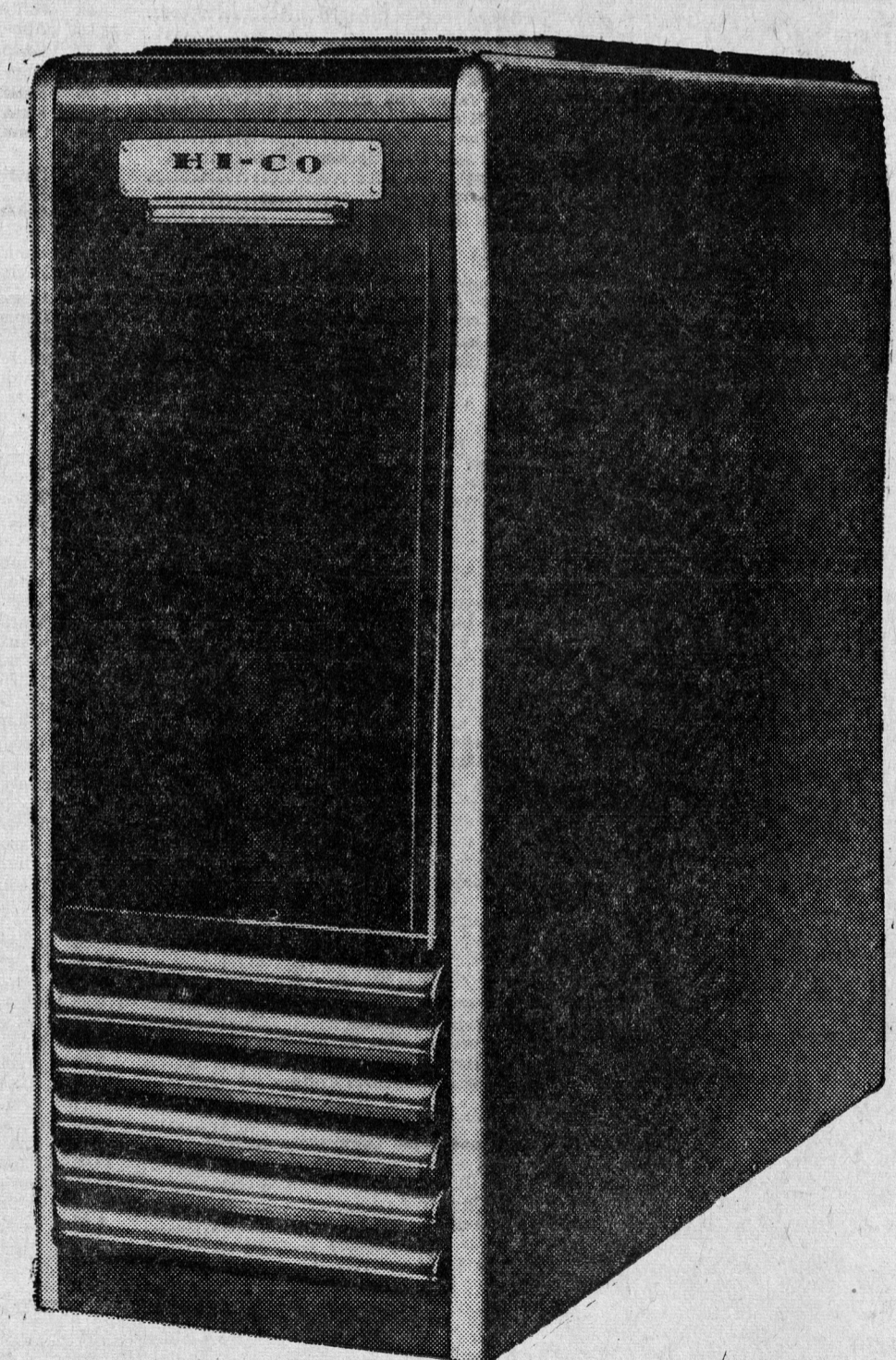
