SLOW!

A characteristic of the Liberal party, in power, is exceeding slowness of action. We have lately seen this characteristic exhibited in respect to the appointment of a Lieutenant Governor.

But the slowness of movement of which the country complains is not confined to the appointment of Governors and Judges or the prosecution of parliamentary business.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Premier Farquharson has introduced a measure respecting the registration of births and deaths. It provides a Registrar General and Divisional Registrars, and requires fathers and mothers, or those who may stand in the place of the parents, as well as the medical practitioners in attendance, to give notice to the latter in the case of births within thirty days.

Havana is rapidly becoming Americanized. Instead of a bullfight, on a recent Sunday, there was a baseball game; and interest in the match waxed so warm that a close decision by the umpire in the eighth inning almost precipitated a riot.

MORE INTEREST TO PAY.

In the Legislative Assembly, this forenoon, the following resolution was adopted and a bill submitted in accordance therewith:

Resolved, That the Government of this Province have liberty to introduce a bill this present session of this Legislature authorizing the issue of debentures in such form and manner as may be deemed proper for the construction of a wing or annex to the Hospital for the Insane at Falconwood, also for the construction of certain steel bridges and for the purchase and construction of other public works of a permanent nature, such debentures to run for a period of thirty years and to bear interest at a rate not to exceed three per cent per annum payable semi-annually, and the amount for which such debentures shall be issued shall not exceed in the whole the sum of twenty-six thousand dollars; and also to make provision for a sinking fund to redeem such debentures by setting apart every year a sum equal to one and a half per cent on the amount of debentures actually issued.

After the Government have obtained the money, they will—judged by the experience of other years—proceed to use it to pay ordinary expenditures!

NOTES AND COMMENTS.

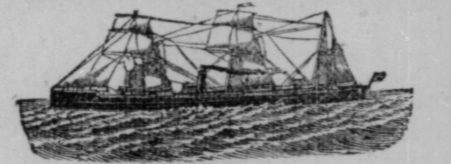

Earncliffe Notes.

Mr. Thos. McPhee, who is to haul the milk from the lower Earncliffe route to the factory at Vernon River this season has succeeded in overcoming a very great inconvenience. The distance from Mr. McPhee's home to the end of the road where he is to begin his loading is by the public road about three miles.

While returning from the lecture delivered by Rev. G. M. Campbell in Vernon River Hall a few evenings ago, what might have been a very serious accident occurred. The carriage owned by Mr. Everett Mutch, owing to a wild horse and the almost impassable condition of the road, broke down.

In the spring of 1898 some of the farmers of the Cherry Valley and Earncliffe school districts formed a club for the purpose of importing for their own use such articles as hardware, seeds, coal, etc., and as a beginning some seed grain valued at less than \$200, was imported. Some idea of the growth of this club may be gathered from the fact that more than a carload of seed was imported this spring.

China Point wharf has not yet been repaired. It has been useless for shipping ever since the Liberals came into power at Ottawa. All but the old "grits" are loud in their denunciations of what is in reality a disgrace to any government.

Messrs. Carey and Morrissey loaded a small schooner with oats and potatoes this spring, and the whole cargo was conveyed from the outer end of such wharf as their is to the schooner in a scow. Mr. Roderick McIsaac also lost some coal that was left on a stray block of this moment of liberal good government.

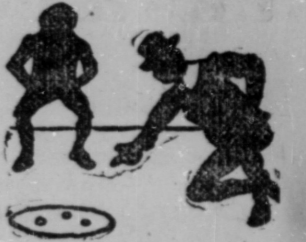
