TORONTO (CP)—Trading was active and prices were steady on good and choice slaughter steers and heifers at the Ontario public stockyards Wednesday.
Heavy steers and lower grade cattle were slow and hard to sell. Cow prices were steady and lamb prices were steady and hogs were lower.

NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market took its third straight loss Wednesday. Trading was moderate.
Volume was 5,300,000 shares compared with 4,270,000 Tuesday.
The Dow Jones Industrial average fell 6.29 to 838.53. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks fell 2.1 to 303.2. Of 1,365 issues traded, 761 fell and 337 rose. Highs for the year totalled 10, lows 132.
Raytheon was the most active stock, up 3/4 at 47 1/2 on 108,500 shares.
Among Canadians, International Nickel dropped 1 1/2, Canadian Pacific 1/2, Alcan 1/2 and Walker Gooderham 1/4. Dome Mines gained 1/4 and Distillers Seagrams 1/4.
Prices declined on the American exchange. Volume was 1,800,000 shares compared with 1,780,000 Tuesday.
Scurry Rainbow Oil dropped 2 1/2, Preston 1/2, Canadian Marconi 1/4 and Canadian Invelin 1/4. Brazilian Tracoin gained 1/4.

MONTREAL (CP)—Stocks, slid lower Wednesday in light trading on the Montreal Stock Exchange.
Declines almost doubled advances 101 to 58 on the two Montreal exchanges. On the senior board the breakdown was 88 to 100.

DENISON—Denison dropped four points to 59 among the uranium, Alcan, another uranium issue, was the most active stock on 28,900 shares. It closed 1/2 lower at 26 1/2. Canadian Breweries was up 1/4 to 6 1/2 in transactions of 18,615 and Labatt, unchanged at 17 1/2.
In mines, Hudson Bay Mining slipped 1 1/2 points to 76 1/2. Noranda 1 1/2 to 75 1/2 and International Nickel one to 91 1/2. Inco dipped to a low of 89 1/2.
Noranda Mines weakened following an announcement that the company reduced its overseas price of copper by 50 cents a pound to 145.00.
CPR closed 1/2 lower at 59 1/2 among the industrials. Massey-Ferguson and Distillers Seagrams each ended 1/4 down at 33 1/2 and 40 1/2. International Paper Line eased 1/4 to 77 1/2. Banks were unchanged to shaded.
Papers were irregularly mixed. Consolidated added 1/4 at 38 1/2 and Donat 1/4 at 17 1/2. Albit first lost 1/2 to 28 1/2 and Albit 1 1/2 to 30 1/2.
Among senior oil stocks, Texaco dropped one point to 7 1/2. Pacific Petroleum hit a low at 10 1/2. Lower B.A. Oil and Trans-Canada Pipe Line advanced 1/4 to 32 and 32 1/2. Steel of Canada traded, 2,012 shares, rising 1/4 to 23 1/2.
On index, industrials eased 0.67 at 156.07; banks 0.32 at 113.77; utilities 0.66 at 137.04; papers firmed 0.21 at 115.52. The composite index dipped 0.63 at 148.50.

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Corp. whose chief asset is Denison shares, was off 1 to 13 1/4. Inco declined 1 1/2 to 90 1/4 after touching a low of 89 1/4.
In other base-metal activity, Noranda dropped 1 1/2 to 52 1/2 after the company announced it lowered its overseas price of copper to £450 a long ton from £500. Pine Point retreated 1 1/2 to 58 and Falconbridge 1 1/2 to 96 1/2.

HEAVY TRADING
Jays Exploration slid 6 1/2 to 40 1/2 cents on 758,901 shares in speculative mines following an announcement by the company that three drill holes in their Vancouver property in the Yukon showed no economic mineralization. Anglo Union Development climbed 14 cents to 1.08.
In the industrial list, International Minerals fell 1 1/2 to a low of 64, CPR 1/2 to 59 and Du Pont 1/4 to 4 1/2.

Scurry Rainbow, which had trading in its shares halted temporarily on the Toronto exchange and the American exchange in New York, declined 2 1/2 to 29 1/2. The stock was held up to match an influx of orders. L. C. Morrison, president of Scurry, announced Wednesday the company's potash exploration drilling program in Saskatchewan has proved to be a body of high-grade potash.

Among other western oil activity, Pacific Petroleum was off 1/4 to a low of 10 1/2.
On index, golds were down 5.30 to 187.63, base metals 2.38 to 94.49, western oils 7.8 to 105.23, and the TSE 32 to 149.14. Volume was 3,214,000 shares compared with 2,750,000 Tuesday.

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TORONTO (CP)—Denison tumbled 1/2 to 57 1/2 and the rest of the market followed as the Toronto Stock Exchange closed on a heavy slump to its lowest level Wednesday since June, 1964.
The index, a measure of key stock movements, slid 63 to 156 1/2.
Denison, a recent investor favorite, fell on news of lower earnings for the first six months of 1966 of \$4,568,000 compared with \$6,034,000 last year.
