CZAR'S PEACE COMMISSION
Will Meet Early in January.
VIENNA, Oct. 15.—Trustworthy information which has just reached Vienna from St Petersburg is to the effect that the conference of the nations, to meet at the Czar's desire for the discussion of plans looking to a general disarmament of the European powers, will be held in the Russian capital early in January. It is intended that no ulterior purpose in the mind of any of the rulers who shall be represented shall color the deliberations of the conference, and by the express orders of the Russian Emperor members intruding upon this restriction will be excluded from further participation in the convention. The problem of universal disarmament then will be treated alone and from a strictly humanitarian point of view.
The precise date of the conference has not been fixed, but it will be decided on the return from leave of absence of Count Muravieff, the Russian Minister for Foreign Affairs.

TROUBLE IN MOROCCO.
Rioters Attempt to Seize the Sherifian Treasure.
TANGIER, Morocco, Oct. 15.—Serious disturbances have taken place in Taflet, which is one of the great sub-divisions of the Empire, and is used as a place of banishment for political offenders. A large body of rioters has captured the uncle of the Sultan, and according to the latest advices received, the rioters were attempting to seize the Sherifian treasure.

ESTEEMED EXCHANGES
Calgary Herald: "It is true that Mr. Forget has done service to the Liberal party—very valuable service. But it was done while he was in receipt of a considerable salary from the public purse. —There is a good deal of conjecture in New Brunswick as to what the provincial government will do. The view reported is that, in view of the danger of meeting the house and the greater danger of meeting the people, with the present feeling, that the ministers will lie quiet in the hope that the storm will blow over, and will dissolve in January about the time session would usually begin.

—La Minerve, speaking of the irregularities and frauds of the plebiscite, says that in some sections of the province of Quebec, the returns show more votes against prohibition than there are voters in these sections; and it mentions a case where one man voted forty five times. With such methods Sir Wilfrid's friends could easily get the majority he desired.
