

CURRENT NOTES.

The Municipal Council of Paris has voted twenty thousand francs to defray the expenses of delegates to the World's Fair at Boston.

There was a violent thunderstorm in various portions of England recently. Four soldiers are reported to have been killed at Chatham.

Three thousand families have been driven from their homes and six thousand head of cattle and other stock drowned by the floods on the Mississippi near St. Louis.

At a liquor dealers meeting in Illinois the other day a member of the Legislature advanced, a new argument against total abstinence. He said he had recently made a special comparison between Maine and Wisconsin, the latter having been called the "beer-guzzling State." In Maine he found that there was one insane person for every 420 of the population, while in Wisconsin there was but one insane person for every 550. In Maine there was an idiot to every 520 persons and in Wisconsin one to every 600, while there was one criminal to every 1500 in Maine and one in 2500 in Wisconsin.

Major-General Stewart, in an article on still hunting, says that a spirit of the best quality of the flavor has been distilled by men by the side of a burn, who were perhaps shifting their quarters weekly, mating on the open health, and hurrying on the whole process to avoid detection. Yet with all these disadvantages, they received the highest price in the market. The quantity produced might be less, but the quality was incomparably superior. Several of the irregular distillers were, for experiment, employed in a licensed distillery, with directions to proceed in their own way; yet with the best utensils, water, and fuel, they produced a spirit quite inferior to what they made under shelter of a rock or, in a den.

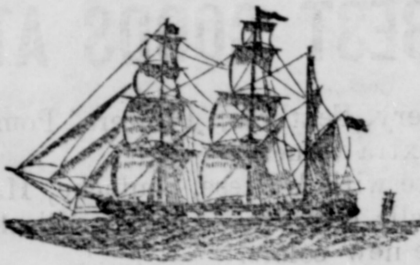

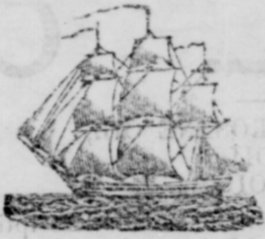

DOMINION OF CANADA.

Province of Prince Edward Island. IN THE SUPREME COURT.

In pursuance of an order of Mr. Justice Peters, dated the sixth day of June, 1883, in the matter of an Act of the Parliament of Canada, passed in the forty-fifth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, Chapter 23, intitled "An Act respecting Insolvent Banks, Insurance Companies, Loan Companies, Building Societies and Trading Corporations, and of the President, Directors and Company of the Bank of Prince Edward Island, an Insolvent Banking Company.

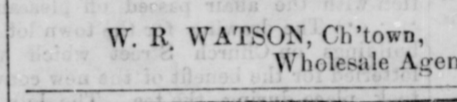
