WEST LIVERPOOL, England, (AP)—The firmest "no" the prize fight game has heard in years came Tuesday from retired flyweight Teddy Gardner when he reportedly was offered a world title fight by Japan's Yoshio Shirai.

"I am retired. I am staying retired. I would not go to Tokyo if there were 20,000 pounds (\$36,000) in it for me," Gardner said.

British press reports said Dr. F. Cash, manager of Japan's world champ, made the offer. Gardner retired last year after losing to Jake Tuli.
